THE CLWYD BIRD REPORT 1980 & 1981

INTRODUCTION.

The production of these two reports at last brings the Clwyd Bird Report up to date and work on the next report, for the first time, has commenced before the end of the year.

The number of records received has again increased and it is hoped that this is reflected in the quality of the reports.

The success of subsequent reports will largely depend upon the effort being sustained and, if possible, improved. Early submission of your notes to the County Recorder will help to ensure that this is achieved.

At the outset the Editorial Committee decided to accept the validity of all records received without subjecting them to any vetting process. It is felt that this is not a satisfactory situation and that a few records have given cause for concern. It is our intention to consider the introduction of vetting procedures before the production of future reports.

Finally the Editorial Committee would like to thank all those observers who have contributed to these and previous reports by kindly submitting their records.

SYSTEMATIC LIST OF BIRDS RECORDED 1980

The nomenclature and systematic arrangement follows that of the 'British Birds' List of Birds of the Western Palearctic.

RED-THROATED DIVER

Gavia stellata

Only recorded on four occasions during the year: A single bird at Rhos Point on 1st February and two birds on the 3rd: 2 birds at Point of Ayr on the 9th October and 1 on 16th October.

LITTLE GREBE

Tachybaptus ruficollis

Recorded regularly on most inland waters with a maximum count of 18 birds at Sealand Reservoirs on 1st January.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE

Podiceps cristatus

Small numbers recorded offshore during winter months and inland at Shotton Pools and Llyn Helyg. Maximum counts: 5 off Abergele 1st November and 12 at Shotton 30th November. Also reported during summer months from several inland waters and breeding confirmed at one site.

SLAVONIAN GREBE

Podiceps auritus

Single birds at Commah's Quay on 19th and 30th October and two birds present on 28th October. A single bird also present at Llyn Helyg on 27th December.

PULHAR

Pulmarus glacialis

Several records of birds offshore March - September usually during gales. At least 1 pair known to have bred at Llandulas Quarry.

HANI SHEARWATER

Puffinus puffinus

Reports from Gromant and Point of Ayr July / August. Maximum counts: 50 at Gromant on 17th July and 300+ on 25th July.

LEACH'S PETREL

Oceanodrona leucorhoa

Unusually large numbers present in the Dee Estuary in mid - September following westerly gales. In a period of three hours, 314 birds were counted moving west at Point of Ayr on 14th September and on the same day a single bird was reported as far up river as Connah's Quay. On 9th October 20 birds were seen moving west at Point of Ayr.

GANNET

Sula bassana

Regularly recorded offshore June to October: Maximum count 30+birds at Gronant 28th July.

CORNORANT

Phalacrocorax carbo

Frequent reports of birds in Dee Estuary and offshore. Maximum count: 150 at Connah's Quay during October.

Phalacrocorax aristotelis

SHAG

Only confirmed records were: 3 at Point of Ayr on 9th October and 1 at Connah's Quay on 24th October.

BITTERN

Botaurus stellaris

A single bird present at Shotton Reserve 16th January.

GREY HERON

Ardea cinerea

Frequently recorded in Dee and Clwyd estuaries but no reports of breeding birds have been received.

MUTE SWAN

Cygnus olor

Present on several inland waters during Summer but no reports of breeding pairs. Maximum count: 37 at Rhyl Marine Lake on 25th October.

BEWICK'S SWAN

Cygnus columbianus

Reported at Connah's Quay where 3 birds were present on 30th November, at Holt 6 seen 23rd December and Llyn Helyg: 6 present 27th December.

WHOOPER SWAN

Cygnus cygnus

The only record was of 2 birds on Nant-y-Ffrith Reservoir on 5th January.

NOTE. 9 wild swans were seen at Point of Ayr on 9th December but the species could not be determined.

PINK-FOOTED GOOSE

Anser brachyrhynchus

Only records were: circa 100 birds at Connah's Quay 6th January, 25 over Halkyn 25th January, 60 at Flint on 17th February and a single bird on the River Clwyd on 12th April.

WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE

Anser albifrons

Reports of 2 birds at Point of Ayr 20th January and a single bird at Shotton on 2nd. November

GREYLAG GOOSE

Anser anser

A single bird was seen at Shotton Reserve on 2nd November.

CANADA GOOSE

Branta canadensis

Reported from several sites with 5 pairs breeding at Gresford. Maximum counts: 60 at Gresford 17th September and 150 at Hanner Mere 19th October.

SHELDUCK

Tadorna tadorna

Commonly reported in Dee Estuary from Shotton to Point of Ayr. Total count for the Welsh side of the Dee Estuary 1711 on 20th January. Maximum counts: 1037 Plint Marsh 20th January and 300 Point of Ayr on 23rd November. Breeding was reported from Connah's Quay.

Anas galericulata

MANDARIN

A single bird at Connah's Quay on 20th January.

WIGEON

Anas penelope

Regularly reported in moderate numbers from the Dee Estuary. Maximum count: 300 at Connah's Quay in November.

GADVALL

Amas strepera

At Connah's Quay 3 birds present on 25th January and 1 on 3rd September; 2 birds seen at Hanmer Mere on 19th October and 3 at Pant-yr-ochain 4th November.

TRAL

anas crecca

Frequently reported from from Dee and Clwyd estuaries and adjacent wetlands. Maximum counts: 180 at Shotton 8th December, 100 Point of Ayr 23rd November and 40 River Clwyd on 8th March.

MALLARD

Amas platyrhynchos

Commonly reported from inland waters and offshore. Maximum count: 750 Point of Ayr 23rd December.

PINTAIL

Anas acuta

Up to 500 birds present at Connah's Quay in January and 280 at Shotton 8th December.

SHOVELER

Anas clypeata

Small numbers reported at Hanner Mere, Shotton, Connah's Quay and Sealand. Haximum count: 12 at Sealand Reservoirs 27th December.

POCHARD

Aythya ferina

Present at suitable localities during winter months in moderate numbers. Maximum counts: 70 Brickworks Pool, Rhyl 14th November and 125 at Shotton Reserve 27th December.

TUFTED DUCK

Aythya fuligula

Reported to have bred at one site in the County and moderate numbers present at Shotton, Llyn Helyg and Sealand during winter. Maximum count: 45 at Shotton Reserve 17th November.

SCAUP

Aythya marila

Records as follows: - 1 Abergele 8th February, 2 Shotton 12th October, 3 Point of Ayr 12th October and 27 there on the 26th, 8 Marine Lake, Rhyl 12th November.

EIDER

Somateria mollissima

Only 3 records. A pair Gronant 13th May, 3 Gronant 28th May and 1 female Rhos Point 13th November.

LONG-TAILED DUCK

Clangula hyemalis

Single birds at Connah's Quay 26th October and at Shotton 8th December.

COMMON SCOTER

Melanitta migra

Reported offshore in most months of the year. Maximum counts: 40 Point of Ayr 26th July and 250 Pensarn 9th November.

GOLDENEYE

Bucephala clangula

Regular in small numbers on most suitable inland lakes and offshore. Maximum counts: 24 Shotton 17th November and 21 at Connah's Quay 25th December.

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER

Mergus serrator

During winter months regular reports offshore and on some inland waters. Maximum count: 28 Marine Lake Rhyl, 8th November.

GOOSANDER

Hergus merganser

Only record was 52 at Hanner Mere on 3rd December.

RUDDY DUCK

Oxyura jamaicensis

Up to 45 birds present on Hanmer Mere during October and a single bird at Shotton 29th September.

RED KITE

Milvus milvus

On 19th November 2 birds were observed at Dolwen.

MARSH HARRIER

Circus aeruginosus

Single birds at Llyn Helyg on 3rd May, Connah's Quay 3rd May and Point of Ayr on 11th May.

HEN HARRIER

Circus cyaneus

On 19th October 2 immature birds seen on Esclusham Mountain and a single bird near the Horseshoe Pass on the same day. At Connah's Quay 2 males were regularly seen during November and December and a male seen at Shotton 5th December.

MONTAGU'S HARRIER

Circus pygargus

A Male was observed at Shotton on 24th June, 4th and 22nd. July and a male, presumably the same bird, was also reported at Connah's Quay on 22nd. July.

SPARROWHAWK

Accipiter misus

Reported on 30 occasions from a wide variety of sites.

BUZZARD

Buteo buteo

Reported regularly in the west of the County, most records involving single birds.

OSPREY

Pandion haliaetus

A single bird observed at Point of Ayr on 25th May.

KESTREL

Palco tinnunculus

Common.

MERLIN Falco columbarius

Reported on at least 16 occasions, most records involving birds wintering along the coastal strip.

PEREGRINE

Falco peregrinus

Reported on 15 occasions usually wintering birds in the coastal strip.

RED GROUSE

Lagopus lagopus

Recorded in small numbers from Clwyddian Pange. An unusual record was of a bird at Point of Ayr on 15th November.

BLACK GROUSE

Tetrao tetrix

Reported at leks from several localities in the Clwyddian hills.

GREY PARTRIDGE Perdix perdix

Fairly common, reported from many areas.

PHEASANT

Phasianus colchicus

Common.

WATER RAIL

Rallus aquaticus

All reports refer to up to only 3 birds. Records from Padeswood, Shotton, Connah's Quay and Pant-yr-ochain and also on the coast at Point of Ayr and Gronant.

MOORHEN

Gallinula chloropus

Common. Maximum count: 21 birds at Padeswood 21st November.

COOT

Pulica atra

Present on most suitable lakes and pools. Maximum count: +0 at the Brickworks Pool, Rhyl on 14th November.

OYSTERCATCHER

Haematopus ostralegus

Only reported to have bred at Shotton. Maximum counts: 23,000 Point of Ayr 23rd November and 12,000 there on 23rd December.

LITTLE RINGED PLOVER

Charadrius dubius

A single bird present at Shotton 11th May and from the 4th to 30th July and 2 birds at Sealand on 17th August.

RINGED PLOVER

Charadrius hiaticula

At Gronant 14 pairs reared 25 young. Also a common passage migrant. Maximum count: 68 on 26th October.

GOLDEN PLOVER

Pluvialis apricaria

No reports of breeding received. Present in moderate numbers August to April. Maximum counts: 150 Flint Marsh 20th January, 200 Sandycroft 3rd April, 176 Sealand 12th October and 80 Point of Ayr 23rd November.

Pluvialis squatarola

GREY PLOYER

Regularly reported from the coastal strip. Maximum counts: 100 Gronant 26th October, 48 Point of Ayr 13th November and 73 there 7th December.

LAPUTNG

Vanellus vanellus

Common. Maximum counts: 1000 River Clwyd 9th February and 1500 there on 27th December, 2000 Queensferry on 22nd November and a similar number at Connah's Quay in Pebruary.

KHOT

Calidris canutus

Numbers of wintering birds on the Welsh side of the Dee still remain low compared with former years. Maximum count: 1000 Point of Ayr 23rd November.

SANDERLING

Calidris alba

No counts during spring passage; 300 recorded at Gronant 26th October was the maximum count.

LITTLE STINT

Calidris minuta

Single birds at Connah's Quay 3rd May and at Rhos Point on 1st February.

CURLEW SANDPIPER

Calidris ferruginea

Single birds at Connah's Quay during spring and autumn passage.

PURPLE SANDPIPER Calidris maritima

At Rhos Point 10 birds were present on 3rd February and 40 on the Clwyd Estuary on 24th February.

DUNLIN

Calidris alpina

Common. Maximum count: 4000 Point of Ayr 23rd December.

RUFF Philomachus pugnax

There were 6 birds at Shotton 6th April and a single bird there on 4th July and 5 at Sealand on 17th August. Also recorded at Connah's Quay.

JACK SNIPE

Lymnocryptes minimus

At Shotton Pools 5 birds present on 1st January and a single bird there on 20th December.

SHIPE

Gallinago gallinago

Regularly reported at Shotton, Point of Ayr, Connah's Quay and Padeswood. Maximum count: 48 at Shotton 23rd November. Although known to breed in the County no records of breeding were received in 1980.

WOODCOCK

Scolopax rusticola

Birds roding reported from Hawarden and Loggerheads. Also scattered winter records usually of single birds.

BLACK-TAILED GODWIT

Limosa limosa

Less numerous than in former years but reported from Connah's Quay, Flint Marsh and Point of Ayr. Maximum count: 100 Point of Ayr 6th November.

BAR-TAILED GODWIT

Limosa lapponica

Records from Point of Ayr, Gronant and Connah's Quay. Maximum count: 200 Point of Ayr 23rd November.

WHIMBREL

Numenius phaeopus

Single birds at Llandulas 12th August and Point of Ayr 9th September; 24 birds reported at Connah's Quay on 30th July.

CURLEW

Numenius arquata

Common. Several breeding records from Clwyddian range. Passage birds at Point of Ayr reached a maximum of 1000 on 27th August.

SPOTTED REDSHANK

Tringa erythropus

Only reported from Connah's Quay and Shotton. Maximum counts: 100 at Connah's Quay 27th August and 32 at Shotton 22nd July.

REDSHANK

Tringa totanus

Common. Maximum count: 500 Rhyl Marine Lake 12th January. Breeding reported from Shotton Marsh and Llandegla Moors.

GREEVSHARK

Tringa mebularia

Frequently recorded in the Dee Estuary, most records being between July and October. Maximum counts: 12 at Connah's Quay and 12 at Point of Ayr on 14th September.

GREEN SANDPIPER

Tringa ochropus

Recorded in most months of the year most frequently at Shotton Marsh. Maximum counts: 8 at Shotton on 11th July and 8 there on 28th August and 6 at Padeswood on 20th August.

WOOD SANDPIPER

Tringa glareola

Records as follows: - 4 Connah's Quay July to August, 1 Point of Ayr 14th July. and at Shotton: 1 on 31st July, 1 on 15th August, 2 on 17th August, 1 on 26th August and 1 on 28th September.

COMMON SANDPIPER

Actitis hypoleucos

Few records received in 1980 - 4 at Llyn Helyg 6th July, 8 at Shotton 11th July and 4 there 1st August.

TURNSTONE

Arenaria interpres

Small numbers reported from Dee Estuary.

RED-NECKED PHALAROPE

Phalaropus lobatus

A female bird present at Shotton from 17th to 30th May. This is apparently the first record of this species in the County.

Stercorarius pomarinus

POMARINE SKUA

A single bird at Gronant on 14th July.

ARCTIC SKHA

Stercorarius parasiticus

Several records between July and September from Point of Ayr and Gronant and a single bird at Llandulas on 30th August. Maximum counts: 4 Gronant on 18th July and 8 at Point of Ayr on 14th September.

GREAT SKUA

Stercorarius skua

Single birds at Point of Ayr on 12th and 14th September and one at Connah's Quay on 7th September.

MEDITERRANEAN GULL

Larus melanocephalus

An immature bird at Llyn Helyg 14th March.

LITTLE GULL

Larus minutus

A single bird at Gronant 5th July.

BLACK-HEADED GULL

Larus ridibundus

Abundant. Reported breeding from Shotton, Connah's Quay and Llyn Helyg.

COMMON GULL

Larus canus

Common winter visitor. Maximum counts: 1000 Sealand 30th November and 1350 there 5th December.

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL

Larus fuscus

Common. Maximum counts: up to 300 Commah's Quay in June and up to 800 there in August and 100 Sealand 5th December.

HERRING GULL

Larus argentatus

Abundant.

GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL

Larus marinus

Common.

KITTIWAKE

Rissa tridactyla

Regular Point of Ayr to Rhos Point. Maximum count: 25 Rhyl 18th September.

SANDWICH TERM

Sterna sandvicensis

Regular and common on coast particularly during late summer. Maximum counts: 650 Point of Ayr 28th July and 400 there 12th September.

COMMON TERM

Sterna hirundo

The colony at Shotton Reserve continues to flourish and is probably the largest in Wales. Common in estuary in late summer and 2 birds at Gresford Flash in late June.

ARCTIC TERN

Sterna paradisaea

Only confirmed record was of 2 birds at Llandulas on 29th July.

LITTLE TERN

Sterna albifrons

At Gronant 24 pairs raised approximately 21 young. Maximum count: 300 birds on 17th July.

BLACK TERN

Chlidonias niger

A single bird at Shotton on 11th May and up to 11 birds at Point of Ayr between 25th July and 10th August.

WHITE-WINGED BLACK TERM

Chlidonias leucopterus

At Point of Myr 3 birds of this species were reported with Black Terms on 25th July.

GUILLEHOT

Uria aalge

Small numbers reported offshore and a single bird in the upper estuary at Connah's Quay 23rd February.

RAZORBILL

Alca torda

Not reported.

STOCK DOVE

Columba oenas

Reported breeding at Gresford and Padeswood.

WOODPIGEON

Columba palumbus

Common.

COLLARED DOVE

Streptopelia decaocto

Common.

TURTLE DOVE

Streptopelia turtur

Reported from Hawarden, Hoseley and Wepre woods.

CUCKOO

Cuculus canorus

Connon.

BARN OWL

Tyto alba

Scarce. Only records were of single birds at Llay 29th October, Denbigh 30th October and Hoseley 28th December.

LITTLE OUL

Athene noctua

Regularly reported from several localities with a number of breeding records.

TAWNY OWL

Strix aluco

Common.

SHORT-EARED OWL

Asio flammeus

Several winter records from coastal strip and two records from suitable breeding moorland areas.

NIGHTJAR

Caprimulgus europaeus

Only record was of birds heard regularly at Dyserth in July.

SWIFT

Apus apus

Common. First reported on 4th May from two well seperated localities. Latest date 10th September.

KINGFISHER

Alcedo atthis

Only records are from Connah's Quay and Shotton with 1 - 2 birds present August to October.

GREEN WOODPECKER

Picus viridis

Recorded in several localities.

GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER

Dendrocopos major

Common.

LESSER SPOTTED WOODPECKER

Dendrocopos minor

Reported from Pant-yr-ochain, Rhostyllen and Hawarden.

SAND MARTIN

Riparia riparia

Colonies still not back to former strength 90 Connah's Quay 17th April.

SWALLOW

Hirundo rustica

Abundant.

HOUSE MARTIN

Delichon urbica

Common. Late record 29th October at Rhydymwyn.

SKYLARK

Alauda arvensis

CORROR.

RICHARD'S PIPIT

Anthus novaeseelandiae

A bird was present at Shotton on 22nd November. This record is subject to ratification by the British Birds Rarities Committee.

TREE PIPIT

Anthus trivialis

Recorded at Maeshafn, Loggerheads and Llandegla.

MEADOW PIPIT

Anthus pratensis

Common.

ROCK PIPIT

Anthus spinoletta

Only record was of 3 birds at Shotton 8th December.

YELLOW WAGTAIL

Motacilla flava

Совнов-

GREY WAGTAIL

Motacilla cimerea

Common breeding species in Clwyddian Range.

WHITE WAGTAIL

Motacilla alba alba

Only records were of 4 birds at Abergele 21st April, 30 at Connah's Quay in mid-April and 1 at Shotton 7th July.

PIED WAGTAIL

Motacilla alba

Common.

WAXWING

Bombycilla garrulus

One present at Pont-y-Ddol 23rd November.

DIPPER

Cinclus cinclus

Commonly reported from the River Alyn at Loggerheads and other suitable streams in the Clwyddian range.

WREN

Troglodytes troglodytes

Connon.

DUNNOCK

Prunella modularis

Common.

ROBIN

Erithacus rubecula

Common.

REDSTART

Phoenicurus phoenicurus

Regularly reported from Clwyddian Range.

WHINCHAT

Saxicola rubetra

Breeds in Clwyddian range and less frequently on coast at Shotton.

STORECHAT

Saxicola torquata

Breeding reported from Shotton, Connah's Quay and Llandegla.

WHEATEAR

Oenanthe oenanthe

Common as breeding species in Clwyddian Hills particularly in the Cilcain area. A single bird showing the characteristics of the Greenland race at Abergele 29th April.

RING OUZEL

Turdus torquatus

Only record was of 2 males at Moel Arthur on 5th April.

BLACKBIRD

Turdus merula

Abundant.

PIELDPARE

Turdus pilaris

Common winter visitor - first autumn record 15th October. Maximum count: 150 Denbigh 23rd January.

SONG THRUSH

Turdus philomelos

Common.

REDWING

Turdus iliacus

Common winter visitor; first autumn record 12th October.

MISTLE THRUSH

Turdus viscivorus

Common. 40 recorded at Gresford in March and 30 at Dyserth on 1st October.

GRASSHOPPER WARBLER

Locustella naevia

Reported from several localities.

SEDGE WARBLER

Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

Common in suitable localities, particularly at Shotton.

REED WARBLER

Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Small colony at Shotton and a single bird ringed at Marford in August.

LESSER WHITETHROAT

Sylvia curruca

Recorded in several localities.

WHITETHROAT

Sylvia communis

Number of records suggests that the species is slowly increasing.

GARDEN WARBLER

Sylvia borin

Pairly common in Clwyddian Range.

BLACKCAP

Sylvia atricapilla

Common. Wintering records include: a male at Pant-yr-ochain on 30th November and at Hoseley in February and March.

WOOD WARBLER

Phylloscopus sibilatrix

Birds, apparently breeding, reported at Loggerheads and Hawarden.

CHIPPCHAFF

Phylloscopus collybita

Common. Wintering records: 4 Point of Ayr 25th November, 2 Rhyl 18th December and 1 Rhuddlan 28th December.

WILLOW WARBLER

Phylloscopus trochilus

Abundant.

GOLDCREST

Regulus regulus

Common.

PIRECREST

Regulus ignicapillus

Reported as follows:- 1 Rhydymwyn 20th November, 1 Rhys-y-Cae 30th November, 1 Downing 23rd November, 3 Point of Ayr 23rd November and 1 Point of Ayr 9th December.

SPOTTED PLYCATCHER

Muscicapa striata

Common in Clwyddian Hills.

LONG-TAILED TIT

Aegithalos caudatus

Fairly common.

HARSH TIT

Parus palustris

Common in Clwyddian Range.

WILLOW TIT

Parus montanus

Pairly common but local.

COAL TIT

Parus ater

Pairly common.

BLUE TIT

Parus caeruleus

Abundant.

GREAT TIT

Parus major

Abundant.

NUTHATCH

Sitta europaea

Commonly reported from woodland areas.

TREECREEPER

Certhia familiaris

Common in woodland areas.

GOLDEN ORIOLE Oriolus oriolus

A male was present at Gwysaney Woods on 17th May.

RED-BACKED SHRIKE Lamius collurio

An immature bird at Point of Ayr on 12th October.

JAY Garrulus glandarius

Common.

MAGPIE Pica pica

Common.

JACKDAW Corvus monedula

Pairly Common but local. Maximum count: 400+ Horseshoe Pass 19th October.

ROOK Corvus fragilegus

Common.

CARRIOS CROS COFOSS

Common.

RAVEN COITUS COITE

Records as follows: 9 at Horseshoe Pass 19th October, 2 Moel Fammau 28th November and 2 Rhyl 13th December.

2 Hoel rammau 28th Movember and 2 May1 13th December.
Starling Sturm

TARLING Sturaus Vulgaria

Abundant.

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Common.

TREE SPARROW Passer montaness

Local: - isolated flocks reported during winter months.

CHAPPINCH Fringilla coelebs

Common.

BRAMBLING Fringilla sontifringilla

Reported in several areas. Maximum counts: 750 Shotton Reserve 20th January and 150 Halkyn 30th November.

GREENFINCH Carduelis chloris

Common.

GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

Commonly reported in moderate numbers.

SISKIN

Carduelis spinus

Only records: - a pair at Hold 8th May and 39 at Prestatyn 23rd December.

LINNET

Carduelis cannabina

Common.

TVITE

Carduelis flavirostris

Only records were of 51 birds at Prestatyn on 28th August and single birds at Connah's Quay August to September.

REDPOLL

Carduelis flammea

Common.

CROSSBILL

Loxia curvirostra

Only report was of a single bird at Gwernaffield 20th November.

BULLFINCH

Pyrrhula pyrrhula

Common.

HAWFINCH

Coccothraustes coccothraustes

At Halkyn 2 males present 15th January and 4 there on 30th November.

LAPLAND BUNTING

Calcarius lapponicus

A single bird at Point of Ayr on 13th November.

SHOW BUNTING

Plectrophenax mivalis

Records as follows:- 4 Gronant 3rd March, 7 Point of Ayr 13th November, 9 Gronant 25th November and 26 Gronant 13th December.

YELLOWHAMMER

Emberiza citrimella

Common. A flock of 200 was observed at Borras on 12th February.

REED BUNTING

Emberiza schoeniclus

Common but local. Most frequently recorded in areas adjacent to the Dee Estuary.

CORN BUNTING

Miliaria calandra

Only breeding records were from Sealand. At Shotton Reserve 85 birds were present on 1st February.

SYSTEMATIC LIST OF BIRDS RECORDED 1981

The nomenclature and systematic arrangement follows that of the 'British Birds' List of Birds of the Western Palearctic.

RED-THROATED DIVER

Gavia stellata

Only reported on four occasions as follows: - 2 at Point of Ayr 8th January and 1 there on 15th August, 2 at Gronant on 3rd October and 6 at Rhos Point on 28th December.

BLACK-THROATED DIVER

Gavia arctica

Only recorded on one occasion when 2 birds were seen off Rhos Point on 28th December.

LITTLE GREBE

Tachybaptus ruficollis

Widely reported from most inland waters and on coast during winter months. Maximum counts were 13 at Sealand Reservoir on 6th October and 12 at Hanmer Mere 6th December.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE

Podiceps cristatus

Frequently recorded offshore and on several inland lakes such as Llyn Brenig, Hanmer Mere and Ysceifiog where there were 20 birds on 25th October. At Shotton a pair bred raising 3 young. Breeding also reported from Pant-yr-ochain and Acton.

SLAVONIAN GREBE

Podiceps auritus

At Llyn Helyg single birds were present on 2nd January and on 26th January and 16 birds were seen off Rhos Point on 20th December. Also a single bird at Connah's Quay on 12th August.

FULHAR

Pulmarus glacialis

Apparently breeding at Prestatyn Quarry where there were 11 birds on 14th March. Single birds seen at Connah's Quay on 19th April and at Prestatyn on 22nd April.

MANY SHEARWATER

Puffiaus puffiaus

Several birds passing offshore at Gronant during a gale on 17th June.

GAMMET

Sula bassana

Several records offshore Point of Ayr to Rhyl. Maximum Count: 10 at Point of Ayr 3rd October.

CORNORANT

Phalacrocorax carbo

Common offshore and in the Dee Estuary. Maximum counts: 89 at Point of Ayr on 3rd October and 96 at Connah's Quay 11th October.

BITTERN

Botaurus stellaris

A single bird was reported from Kinnel Bay on 1st May.

GREAT WHITE EGRET

Egretta alba

A bird of this species was reported at Gronant on 29th May. The record is currently being examined by the Rarities Committee.

GREY HERON

Ardea cinerea

Common in upper reaches of Dee Estuary and several records inland but no reports of breeding in the County. Maximum count: 14 at Shotton 8th September and 18 at Connah's Quay 6th September.

MUTE SWAN

Cygnus olor

Breeding reported from five sites in the Gresford area and birds also present at Shotton, Padeswood, Ysceifiog, Rosset, Gronant and Connah's Quay. Maximum counts: 35 Rhyl Marine Lake 24th October and 52 there on 15th November.

BRUICK'S SWAM

Cygnus columbianus

A small flock of 6 birds were present at Llyn Helyg from 2nd January to 7th March. Also 5 birds at Hanmer Mere on 7th January, 19 at Gronant on 23rd February and 3 at Rhyl on 9th December.

PINK-POOTED GOOSE

Anser brackyrhynchus

Small flocks recorded as follows:- 80 over Gronant on 31st January, 22 at Bodelwyddan on 20th December and 80 there 27th. December. Single birds were observed at Gronant on 20th December and at Prestatyn on 21st December.

GREYLAG GOOSE

Anser anser

On 5th April 2 birds were seen at Shotton.

CANADA GOOSE

Branta canadensis

A pair bred at Padeswood rearing 2 young and birds were reported from several other lakes. Maximum counts: 6 at Abergele 26th January and 11 over Gronant 6th June.

BRENT GOOSE

Branta bernicla

A single dark breasted bird at Point of Ayr on 18th January.

SHELDUCK

Tadorna tadorna

Common in Dee Estuary with many records of moderately sized flocks from Shotton to Point of Ayr. Maximum counts: 250 Point of Ayr 14th March, 350 there 22nd November and 500 at Connah's Quay in December. Only record of breeding was from Shotton where a pair were seen with small young.

WIGEON

Anas peaelope

Regularly reported offshore in the Dee Estuary and at Llyn Helyg. Maximum count: 800 at Connah's Quay 14th / 15th December.

GADWALL

Anas strepera

At Shotton 2 pairs present on 20th April and a pair there on 15th May, 2 birds at Gronant on 20th December and 2 at Rhyl on 20th December.

TRAL Anas crecca

Numerous records from the Dee Estuary and surrounding areas and also reported at Padeswood, Llym Helyg, Rhuddlan and Pendinas. Maximum counts: 220 at Shotton 24th Pebruary and 120 there on 8th November and 100 at Point of Myr on 4th January.

BALLARD

Anas platyrhynchos

Common. Maximum counts: 500 Point of Ayr 8th January, 250 Hanner Nere 24th January and 700 at Connah's Quay on 10th September.

PINTAIL

Anas acuta

Common in upper reaches of Dee Estuary during winter months. Baxisum count: 2,100 at Connah's Quay on 10th September.

GARGANEY

Anas geerguedula

Single birds at Shotton on 30th July and 30th August and a male at Connah's Quay on 4th October.

SHOVELER

Anas clypeata

Small numbers reported from several inland waters with larger flocks at Hanmer Here; 45 on 4th October, Pant-yr-ochain; 34 on 9th January and Shotton; 25 on 4th September.

POCHARD

Aythya ferina

Small numbers reported wintering at several lakes including Pant-yr-ochain, Drury, Dolwen and Alven Reservoirs, Padeswood and Ysceifiog. Larger flocks were observed at Shotton, 95 on 10th January, Brickworks Pool, Rhyl, 46 on 22nd January and Rhyl Narine Lake, 125 on 29th November.

TUPTED DUCK

Aythya fuliqula

Birds were reported at nine sites in the County. Maximum counts: 26 at Llyn Helyg 26th January and 27 at Dolwen on 22nd March.

LONG-TAILED DUCK

Clangula hyenalis

A male present at Sealand Reservoir on 1st November.

COMMON SCOTER

Melanitta nigra

Regular records of birds offshore from Point of Ayr to Rhos Point. Maximum counts: 1,000 at Pensarn on 18th December and 300 at Kinnel Bay 5th December.

VELVET SCOTER

Melanitta fusca

A single record of a bird at Llandulas on 27th December.

GOLDENEYE

Bucephala clamqula

Small numbers were observed on several lakes during the winter months and also less frequently noted offshore. Maximum counts: 10 at Shotton Reserve on 1st and 27th March and a similar number there on 16th November, 7 off Point of Ayr on 11th January.

Mergus serrator

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER

Prequent sightings offshore between Point of Ayr and Rhos Point and regularly reported from Rhyl Marine Lake and occasional records from Connah's Quay. Maximum counts: 38 at Llandulas on 27th December and 38 at Rhos on 28th December, 29 at Penrhyn Bay on 23rd January and 11 on Rhyl Marine Lake on 29th November.

GOOSANDER

Mergus mergamser

Most records are from Hanner Mere with a maximum count of 32 on 7th January but a pair was seen on Llyn Brenig on 15th March and a male was present there on 15th November.

RUDDY DUCK

Oxyura jamaicensis

Regular reports from Hanner Mere with 21 there on 7th January and 18 present on 4th October. A pair on the Range Pool at Shotton during June and July were reported to have nested but this was not confirmed.

HEN HARRIER

Circus cyaneus

A male was observed at Shotton on 15th February and on 5th April and there was also a male at Minera om 30th and 31st May. A single bird seen at Connah's Quay on several occasions during January and February, 2 males there on 6th March and singles on 11th and 15th October.

GOSHAWK

Accipiter gentilis

A single bird seen over Esclusham Mountain on 1st April was the only record.

SPARROWHANK

Accipiter nisus

Over 50 records were received covering many areas in the County. Although it is necessary to be cautious when drawing conclusions in such cases the frequency of sightings does suggest a steady increase in the number of Sparrowhawks in the area.

BUZZARD

Buteo buteo

Almost all records are from the south and west of the County with a maximum count of 5 at Clocaenog Forest 24th January. Only one record of birds breeding. Unusual records were of single birds at Abergele on 29th May and at Llandulas on 26th December.

KESTREL

Falco tinnunculus

Common.

MERLIN

Palco columbarius

Reported on 24 occasions; all records with the exception of a bird at Moel-y-Faen on 12th April were from the coastal strip.

HOBBY

Falco subbuteo

A bird was reported at Connah's Quay on 11th August.

Falco peregriaus

PEREGRINE

There were 22 reports, all of single birds on the coastal strip, during the year. A pair of birds were also reported in a suitable breeding area during the summer.

RED GROUSE

Lagopus lagopus

Pairly common in moorland areas - 30 were present on the Horseshoe Pass on 9th November.

BLACK GROUSE

Tetrao tetrix

Several reports of birds from six well separated areas in the Clwyddian Range. Maximum counts: 10 birds at Ruabon on 9th January and up to 14 there on 10th April.

RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE

Alectoris rufa

A single bird at Sealand on 19th April and a covey of 9 at Shotton on 2nd September.

GREY PARTRIDGE

Perdix perdix

Fairly common with reports of small parties from nine areas in the County.

PHEASANT

Phasianus colchicus

CORNOR.

WATER RAIL

Rallus aquaticus

Regular reports during winter months from Shotton, Padeswood, Gronant and Point of Ayr invariably involving only simgle birds.

BOOREE

Gallinula chloropus

COMMOR-

COOT

Fulica atra

Common on most suitable lakes. Maximum counts; 70 Ysceifiog on 1st November, 63 Rhyl Marine Lake 6th December, 50 Brickworks Pool, Rhyl 12th December and 40 Gresford Flash 1st March.

OYSTERC ATCHER

Baenatopus ostralegus

Bred at Shotton and Connah's Quay. Maximum counts: all refer to Point of Ayr: 14,000 on 7th February, 14,000 on 14th October and 12,000 on 26th December.

LITTLE RINGED PLOVER

Charadrius dubius

Only recorded on four occasions:- 1 at Comnah's Quay on 26th July and 1 there on 20th August, 2 at Rhydymwyn 23rd August and 1 at Shotton on 26th July.

RINGED PLOYER

Charadrius hiaticula

At Gronant some 10 - 12 pairs bred. Few records of numbers during passage were received and the highest count recorded was 50 at Shotton on 31st August.

Pluvialis apricaria

GOLDEN PLOYER

Breeding was confirmed at one moorland site. Elsewhere records are of wintering or passage birds with maximum counts as follows:- up to 600 birds in the Sandycroft / Mancot area between 10th January and 27th March, between 400 and 500 at Sealand during the period 15th March to 27th April and 276 at Prestatyn 31st October. It was not established whether the Sealand and Sandycroft birds were different flocks.

GREY PLOYER

Pluvialis squatarola

Nost records were from Point of Ayr but also reported from Connah's Quay and Sealand. Maximum count for the wintering birds at Point of Ayr was 250 on the 7th February.

LAPVING

Vanellus vanellus

Common in all suitable sites although now absent from several former breeding areas due to drainage schemes. Maximum count: 3,500 at Sealand on 30th January.

KHOT

Calidris camutus

Numbers of wintering / passage birds are still insignificant when compared with a few years ago. Maximum count: 300 at Point of Ayr 26th January.

SANDERLING

Calidris alba

Small numbers wintering reported on coast between Point of Ayr and Rhyl. Maximum count: 280 at Point of Ayr 22nd November.

LITTLE STIET

Calidris minuta

A flock of up to 11 birds present at Gronant between the 4th September and 5th October. Also 3 at Sealand on 13th September and 1 there on 26th September. At Connah's Quay 2 birds on 20th August and 1 there on 3rd September.

TRAMINCK'S STINT

Calidris temminckii

A single bird at Connah's Quay on 20th August.

CURLEW SANDPIPER

Calidris ferruginea

Only records were of single birds at Gronant on 8th August and 20th September and at Connah's Quay; 1 on 23rd August, 1 on 13th September and 3 on 20th September.

PURPLE SANDPIPER

Calidris maritima

A small flock wintering at Rhos Point provided the only records. Maximum count at Rhos was 20 on 29th November.

DUNLIN

Calidris alpina

Common. Maximum count inland was 150 at Sealand on 1st November.

RUFF

Several reports between July and October from Commah's Quay, Shotton and Sealand. Maximum count was of 35 birds on 14th April at Sealand.

JACK SNIPE

Lynnocryptes minimus

Only records were from Gronant where single birds were seen on 23rd February and 16th March and 2 birds present on 1st March.

SNIPE

Gallimago gallimago

Breeding probable but not confirmed at Padeswood. Otherwise a common winter visitor in suitable areas. Maximum count: 46 at Shotton 6th October.

WOODCOCK

Scolopax rusticola

Recorded only at Rhydymwyn and Loggerheads during breeding season. Elsewhere scattered records of 1 - 2 birds during winter months.

BLACK-TAILED GODWIT

Limosa limosa

Apart from 1 - 2 birds at Sealand on 21st and 22nd of March all records refer to Connah's Quay and Point of Ayr. After a number of years when up to 1,000 birds were frequently reported in the Dee Estuary the species now seems to have reverted to it's former status of being less numerous, although significant numbers are sometimes recorded viz. 70 Point of Ayr 19th February and 120 there on 26th December; 125 Connah's Quay 25th February and 75 there on 21st November.

BAR-TAILED GODWIT

Limosa lappomica

Regular reports of small wintering flocks at Point of Ayr from August to April. Highest count at Point of Ayr was 40 on 13th December but 20 birds were also seen at Kimmel Bay on 5th December and 6 at Connah's Quay on 20th October.

WHIMBREL

Numerius phaeopus

Most records confined to the months July to September when the species was recorded on twenty occasions, the highest numbers being 10 at Point of Ayr on 30th August and 6 there on 1st September. During spring passage 3 birds at Connah's Quay on 4th May and 4 there on the 6th.

CURLEY

Numenius arquata

Breedin; confirmed at a number of sites but most records are of wintering or passage birds. Maximum counts: 450 at Point of Ayr on 8th January and 600 on 21st January and at Point of Ayr the following autumn: 1,000 present on 13th September and 570 on 14th October.

SPOTTED REDSHANK

Tringa erythropus

Reports from Connah's Quay, Shotton, Point of Ayr and Sealand.
Most records are from Connah's Quay with highest counts of 60
on 9th August at Connah's Quay and 17 at Shotton on 16th August.

REDSHANK Tringa totanus

Birds were present in the breeding season at Padeswood, Llandegla and Shotton but breeding was not confirmed. Maximum counts: 450 at Point of Ayr on 10th February, 750 at Point of Ayr on 14th October and 650 at Connah's Quay in November.

GREENSHANK

Tringa mebularia

Regular reports were received involving between 1 and 5 birds but there were 9 at Connah's Quay on 20th September, 8 at Shotton on the 8th August and 12 there on 18th August and 15 birds at Point of Ayr on 13th September.

GREEN SANDPIPER

Tringa ochropus

Frequently reported with records covering most months of the year with a maximum of 9 birds at Shotton on 29th July. Most reports were from Shotton / Sealand but the species was also observed at Connah's Quay, Padeswood and Rossett.

WOOD SANDPIPER

Tringa glareola

Only recorded on ten occasions; with the exception of 3 birds at Connah's Quay on 15th August all reports involve single birds.

COMMON SANDPIPER

Actitis hypoleucos

Most reports refer to less than 10 birds but up to 15 birds at Shotton between 12th July and 8th August and 40 at Connah's Quay on 8th July and 26 there on 12th July.

TURNSTONE

Aremaria interpres

Small numbers present from Point of Ayr to Rhos Point but the rocky shore at Rhos Point holds the highest numbers with a maximum of 300 birds on 15th November.

ARCTIC SKUA

Stercorarius parasiticus

Between June and September there were six reports of 1 - 4 birds at Point of Ayr with 4 seen on the 12th June being the highest count.

GREAT SKUA

Stercorarius skua

A single bird was observed at Point of Ayr on 14th September.

LAUGHING GULL

Larus atricilla

This North American species was observed at Colwyn Bay on 27th / 28th December. This is the first record of Laughing Gull in the County of Clwyd.

LITTLE GULL

Larus minutus

Only records were 2 at Point of Ayr on 4th January and 1 at Sealand on 4th May.

Larus ridibundus

BLACK-HEADED GULL

Abundant. Maximum counts: 1,000 at Rhyl 29th November and 612 at Prestatyn 30th November.

COMMON GULL

Larus canus

Common winter visitor with highest counts as follows:- 1300 on 8th February and 2,000+ in Clwyd Estuary 14th March.

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL

Larus fuscus

Fairly common. Maximum count: 200 Connah's Quay 8th June.

HERRING GULL

Larus argentatus

Abundant. Maximum count: 1,200 at Rhuddlan 31st December.

GLAUCOUS GULL

Larus hyperboreus

An immature bird was seen at Shotton Reserve on 6th December.

GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL

Larus marinus

Fairly common. Maximum count: 170 at Gronant on 3rd October.

KITTIWAKE

Rissa tridactyla

Only very few records this year with 3 birds at Point of Ayr on the 4th January being the most seen at any one time. A single bird was also recorded at Connah's Quay on the same date.

SANDWICH TRAN

Sterna sandvicensis

Present in small numbers throughout the summer months. Maximum counts during passage were 60 at Point of Ayr 2nd May, 90 at Gronant and 430 at Point of Ayr on 26th July and 500 at Point of Ayr on 13th September.

COMMON TERM

Sterna hirundo

Another successful year for the colony at Shotton Reserve resulted in over 270 birds fledging and the maximum number of birds seen there was 350 on 8th July.

ARCTIC TERM

Sterna paradisaea

A single bird was reported on 3rd September at Connah's Quay.

LITTLE TERM

Sterma albifroms

The number of young fledged at the Gronant colony was circa 70. During late summer the number of birds at Gronant increased to a maximum of 500 on 25th July.

BLACK TERM

Chlidonias niger

Only records were of 2 birds at Point of Ayr on 9th August and single birds at Gresford Flash on 30th August and 1st October.

GUILLEMOT Uria aalge

Occasional records offshore between Point of Ayr and Rhos Point.
Maximum count was 13 birds on 15th June at Gronant.

RAZORBILL Alca torda

Only one definite record; that of a single bird at Gronant on 30th June.

STOCK DOVE Columba oemas

Breeds in several areas but appears to be local.

WOODPIGEON Columba palumbus

Common. Maximum counts: 387 at Hawarden 21st November, 250 Llyn Helyg 29th November and 248 at Prestatyn on 27th December.

COLLARED DOVE Streptopelia decaocto

Breeding apparently confined to suburban areas where not uncommon

TURTLE DOYE Streptopelia turtur

Infrequently recorded with single birds at Henllan 14th June and Rhydymwyn 7th September. Also reported to be present at Hawarden and Hoseley.

CUCKOO Cuculus canorus

Common. First reported on 22nd April.

BARN OWL Tyto alba

Scarce. Only one or two isolated records from Wrexham area.

LITTLE OWL Athene moctua

Fairly common. Reported from eleven different areas, usually only 1 - 2 birds being involved but 4 birds were seen together at Ruthin on 31st December.

TAWNY OWL Strix aluco

Fairly common.

LONG-EARED OWL Asio otus

Only record was from Halkyn where 1-2 birds were seen on 20th February.

SHORT-EARED OWL Asio flammeus

Several reports from Llandeyla area during the breeding season. Single birds reported on five occasions from Gronant and Shotton.

NIGHTJAR Caprimulqus europaeus

Only record was of a bird heard several times on Ruabon Mountain in early June.

SUIFT Apus apus

Common. The first record was on 7th MAy.

KINGFISHER

Alcedo atthis

There were frequent reports mostly involving single birds but only two were from suitable areas and at the time of year when breeding may have been likely.

GREEN WOODPECKER

Picus viridis

Very few records, all from suitable woodland areas during the breeding season.

GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER

Dendrocopos major

Fairly common.

LESSER SPOTTED WOODPECKER

Deadrocopos minor

Only reported from five areas and in all cases single birds were involved.

SKYLARK

Alauda arvensis

Common. Maximum winter counts were 200 at Trelawnyd on 23rd December and 300 at Rhyl on 27th December.

SHORE LARK

Bremophila alpestris

There were 4 birds at Point of Ayr on 13th December.

SAND MARTIN

Riparia riparia

Still less common than in former years. Breeding confirmed at Gresford were there was a small colony of about 30 pairs.

SWALLOW

Hirundo rustica

Abundant. First recorded on 10th April when 150 birds were seen moving east at Nammerch and last date seen was on 7th November at Gronant. A roost of some 2,000 birds was at Shotton Reserve during August and September.

HOUSE HARTIE

Delichon urbica

Common. The earliest date recorded was 19th April and the species was last seen on 14th October.

TREE PIPIT

Anthus trivialis

Birds, apparently breeding, seen at Llandegla, Maeshafn and Loggerheads. Also 5 at Point of Ayr on 2nd May and 1 there on the 5th.

MEADOW PIPIT

Anthus pratensis

Common. Breeds extensively in moorland areas. Also 297 birds were counted moving at Point of Ayr on 29th March.

Anthus spinoletta

ROCK PIPIT

Single birds reported at Rhos Point on 10th January and 29th November and at Connah's Quay on 9th March.

WATER PIPIT

Anthus spinoletta spinoletta

A single bird at Shotton on 24th Pebruary and a second bird there in summer plumage on on 5th April.

YELLOW WAGTAIL

Motacilla flava

Common but local.

GREY WAGTAIL

Motacilla cinerea

Common on suitable streams and rivers in Clwyddian Range.

WHITE WAGTAIL

Motacilla alba alba

Records for this sub-species as follows:- 1 Connah's Quay 4th April, 1 Abergele 15th April, 4 Shotton 19th April, 6 Range Pool, Shotton 28th April, 8 Sealand 26th April and 2 Shotton on 2nd May.

PIED WAGTAIL

Motacilla alba

Common.

DIPPER

Cinclus cinclus

Commonly reported from upland streams and rivers.

WREN

Troglodytes troglodytes

Connon.

DUNNOCK

Prunella modularis

COMMON.

ROBIN

Erithacus rubecula

Common.

NIGHTINGALE

Luscinia megarhynchos

A bird of this species was present near Bodfari from 23rd May until 10th August.

BLACK REDSTART

Phoenicurus ochruros

A female was present at Rhyl from 2nd to 6th November.

REDSTART

Phoenicurus phoenicurus

This species which was formerly not uncommon in the County is now rather scarce but records suggest a slow recovery.

WHINCHAT

Saxicola rubetra

Present as a breeding species in many upland areas and on coastal strip.

STONECHAT

Saxicola torquata

Uncommon. Reported from several areas in Clwyddian Range and at Shotton and Connah's Quay on the coast. Breeding confirmed at Shotton.

BHEATEAR

Oenanthe oenanthe

Breeding confirmed at three localities in the County including small numbers at sea level at Shotton. At Connah's Quay 10 birds were present on 27th April.

RING OUZEL

Turdus torquatus

Several birds reported between World's End and the Horseshoe Pass and at Llyn Brenig and Llangynhafel.

BLACKBIRD

Turdus merula

Abundant.

PIELDFARE

Turdus pilaris

Common winter visitor. An unusually late record was of 60 birds at Cilcain on 4th May. Maximum count was of 700 birds moving west at Gronant in two and a half hours during snow showers on 9th December.

SONG THRUSH

Turdus philomelos

Common.

REDWING

Turdus iliacus

Moderate numbers reported from several sites in the County during winter months. Highest counts: 100 at Padeswood on 2nd January and 155 at Prestatyn on 27th December. In a two and a half hour watch at Gronant, 2,000 birds were observed moving west during snow showers on 9th December.

MISTLE THRUSH

Turdus viscivorus

Pairly common. Most reports involve small numbers but 23 were seen at Prestatyn on 6th August and 50 at Halkyn on 3rd October.

GRASSHOPPER WARBLER

Locustella maevia

Reported from several localities during breeding season and breeding confirmed at Llay.

SEDGE WARBLER

Acrocephalus schoenobaeaus

Common in suitable localities. Breeding confirmed at Shotton.

REED WARBLER

Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Bred at Shotton Reserve. Only other record was of a single bird at Gronant on 13th August.

LESSER WHITETHROAT

Sylvia curruca

Few records were received. Single birds were observed at Shotton 4th September and at Point of Ayr 13th September. Birds with

young were reported at Rhydymwyn on 17th July and at Connah's Quay on 19th July.

WHITETHROAT

Fairly common, being reported from several areas.

GARDEN WARBLER

Sylvia borin

Fairly common, most records from Clwyddian Ranje.

BLACKCAP

Sylvia atricapilla

Common. Only winter records were; 1 at Abergele on 15th March and a male at Ruthin on 15th December.

ROBELLI'S HARBLER

Phylloscopus benelli

A bird of this species was reported at Point of Ayr on 16th August. This record was not accepted by the Rarities Committee.

WILLOW TIT

Parus montanus

Local-

COAL TIT

Parus ater

Fairly common-

BLUE TIT

Parus caeruleus

Abundant.

GREAT TIT

Parus major

Abundant.

NUTHATCH

Sitta europaea

Common in woodland areas: 15 birds were reported in the Gronant area on 6th December.

TREECREEPER

Certhia familiaris

Common: 20 reported in Gronant area on 6th December.

JAY

Garrulus glandarius

Common.

MAGPIR

Pica pica

Common: 34 birds observed roosting at Padeswood 1st January.

CHOUGH

Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax

Only record was of a pair at Moel y Faen on 12th April.

JACKDAW

Corvus nonedula

Common but somewhat local. Maximum count: 220 at Rhyl on 27th December.

ROOK

Corvus frugilegus

Common. Maximum count: 308 at Prestatyn on 27th December.

CARRION CROW

Corvus corone

Common.

RAVEN

Corvus corar

Reported in small numbers from eleven sites in the County. Breeding confirmed at Mynydd Mawr.

STARLING

Sturnus vulgaris

Abundant-

HOUSE SPARROW

Passer domesticus

Abundant.

TREE SPARROW

Passer montanus

Reported from several areas. Maximum counts: 200 Rossett 1st February, 80 Gresford 15th January and 42 at Trevalyn on 17th April.

CHAPPINCH

Pringilla coelebs

Common. Maximum counts: 200 at Hawarden 16th November and 300 wintering in Moss Hall Bog area.

BRAMBLING

Pringilla montifringilla

Moderate numbers were present in the early part of the year with highest counts of 400 at Gresford on 15th January and 250 at Ewloe on the 7th. Only small numbers reported during autumn and early winter.

GREENFINCH

Carduelis chloris

Common. Maximum count 130 at Point of Ayr 13th December.

GOLDFINCH

Carduelis carduelis

Common. A charm of 30 at Shotton Reserve on 7th January and a similar number at Connah's Quay on 25th November.

SISKIN

Carduelis spinus

Reported from 14 well separated sites in the County, usually in small numbers but circa 40 birds at Prestatyn in January, 32 at Shotton on 8th November and 45 at Ruthin on 12th December.

Common. Maximum count: 300 at Gromant 3rd October.

Only recorded on four occasions; 4 Connah's Quay 8th January and 12 there on 9th March, 1 at Shotton 26th April and 7 Point of Ayr on 13th December.

Loxia curvirostra

Only records were 6 at Prestatyn on 5th January and 30 at Brynhyfryd, Clocaenog Forest on 24th January.

BULLFINCH

Pyrrhula pyrrhula

Common.

HAMPINCH

Coccothraustes coccothraustes

Only recorded at Halkyn as follows:- 4 males and 3 females 15th March, 1 present on 18 March and 6 on 12th April.

SNOW BUNTING

Plectrophenax mivalis

Reported from Point of Ayr, Gronant and Shotton and an unusual record of a single bird at Ninera on 21st March. Highest counts on coast were 32 at Gronant on 8th February and 26 at Point of Ayr on 11th January.

YELLOWHAMMER

Emberiza citrinella

Common: 36 at Point of Ayr on 13th December and 50 at Connah's Quay 25th December.

REED BUNTING

Emberiza schoeniclus

Common: 74 at Gromant 8th February.

CORN BUNTING

Miliaria calandra

Somewhat local. Bred at Sealand and 50 at Shotton Reserve on 24th February.
