

Editorial


The purposes of the bird report

- To present a detailed list of species seen and counted during the year, and for this to be as complete as possible, particularly to assist the conservation of bird populations within the area.
- To present the data from the records in a way that, hopefully, is readable for the general public
 and especially for birders who provide the data.
- To present the data in a way that is useful to anyone, from any agency, who may wish to check
 on the local status of any species.
- To record as accurately as possible the rare and scarce birds that have occurred in the recording area.

Renewal

The average age of members of the Clwyd Bird Recording Group is increasing such that there is concern for its future. The CBRG needs new members and those who are younger than retirement age would be especially welcome. The more volunteers we have the fewer jobs any one person should have to do. I would be happy to discuss the CBRG's requirements with anyone. I was very pleased that Henry Cook agreed to join us and take on the role of Photo Editor. 
Sources of records



For 2016 the Clwyd Bird Recording Group received records from the following sources, from many

locations in North-East Wales, as shown in the map below. The sources were:

- Volunteer observers, mainly via BirdTrack
- RSPB Conwy and Burton Mere Wetlands (reserve staff and volunteers)
- Garden BirdWatch data
- Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) data
- Deeside Naturalists' Society (per Glenn Morris)
- Cofnod
- Records of ringed birds
- Nest record summaries
- WeBS data from the BTO website.
- WBBS (Waterways Breeding Bird Survey) data from the BTO.



Numbers of records

For 2017 I received just over 97,000 records, the majority of which have been imported to Recorder 6. The only records that are not imported are those of some feral or escaped (Category E) species or records of rarities that have not been accepted by the appropriate committee.

Species names

We have continued to use the English vernacular names.

The order of species

This report follows the naming and ordering of species in: British Ornithologists' Union (BOU). 2018. The British List: a Checklist of Birds of Britain (9th edition). *Ibis* 160: 190-240.

Information about species

In this report we have details of 218 species in Categories A and C and 1 in Category E and 8 subspecies.

Under the species names we provide a short description of the status of the species in North-East Wales, with information about whether it is on the Red or Amber lists of conservation concern (Johnstone, I, and Bladwell, S. 2016. Birds of Conservation Concern in Wales 3: the population status of birds in Wales. *Birds in Wales* 13(1): 3-31). The species accounts show whether it is a Section 7 bird (living organism) "of principal importance for the purpose of maintaining and enhancing biodiversity in relation to Wales", (Environment [Wales] Act 2016. The accounts also show interest in the species by the Rare Breeding Bird Panel. See other information in the introduction to the systematic list.

CBRG Website

During the year I maintained the CBRG website and made some minor changes. I have started to

work on a new website that will be shared with the Cambrian Ornithological Society though progress has still been slower than I had would have liked.

BirdTrack

BirdTrack is the method which I would now recommend that all observers (Individuals or organisations) use for the storage and submission of their records. This has many advantages over sending me the records in a spreadsheet. Each observer would have their own database of records that can be examined by the observer in different ways. It would help if observers still used the 1km squares as recording units and the gazetteer is still available (and updated from time to time) from the Downloads page of the CBRG website.

Anyone who stores records in BirdTrack and is happy for the Recorder to be able to access their records does not have to do anything else. At the end of the year, or when I think most people will have added their records for the previous calendar year, I can download all the records in one go.

I would recommend that all observers create a BirdTrack account, at no charge, by visiting the website **www.birdtrack.net** or by visiting the BTO website **www.bto.org**

BirdTrack has now gone global and it is possible to add records from anywhere in the world. This means that your holiday bird records could be available for you and for conservation work in the country you visited. Using the Global portal, observers may also record sightings of mammals and dragonflies. Those records are shared with their wider recording communities.

BirdTrack is also available as an app for iPhone or Android smartphones. It allows observers to record their sightings wherever they are. Uploaded records are available for examination through the Global portal.

Computerisation of records

I continue to use Recorder 6 as the database for holding the records from all the different sources within separate 'surveys', which means that I may search for records supplied by any one or more of the sources listed at the start of the Editorial. Currently, there are 820,137 records in the database. I have made no progress in finding an alternative to Recorder 6.

Submission of records

Records of bird sightings may be made available by:

- by using BirdTrack (www.birdtrack.net);
- using a spreadsheet available on the CBRG website;
- by using the Cofnod on-line record submission facility (www.cofnod.org.uk).
- by using the Dee Estuary website (www.deeestuary.co.uk)

For nest sites, it would be very helpful if observers stored a more accurate grid reference in the Comments. This could be either a 6, 8 or 10 figure reference, depending on whether, or not, a GPS was used.

Please keep records of common species as well as rarities, but of particular concern now are those

species that are:

- either Amber or Red listed.
- species on the Welsh Biodiversity Action Plan (WBAP) list or
- of interest to the Rare Breeding Birds Panel.

Included in this report are maps showing the distribution of all the records we have received for all species which have been recorded at four or more locations.

For your records to be considered for a bird report, please submit the records before the end of March of the following year. After that date they may be too late to include.

If you do use the data recording spreadsheet, it has the names of every 1 km square in the Vice-counties of Denbighshire and Flintshire and some for Meirionnydd (particularly the area of the Berwyn Mountains that were in Clwyd). For data entry the species name is entered by using the BTO two-letter code (in the systematic list, the table with the number of records has each species' code in the top-left corner). The place is entered by using the 1 km grid reference (NB in the format SJ2466, with no spaces or other characters). The grid reference also pulls in the correct VC number.

The other details cannot be known in advance, so they must be entered by the observer: date, observer name(s), sex/stage, breeding code, abundance and comments. When complete please send me the spreadsheet. The records do not have to be in any particular order – it is probably easiest (though not necessary) to use the forms chronologically, just entering the latest observations that you have recorded. The crucial aspects of each record are:

- Species code (this will show the species name used in Recorder 6);
- Date of the observation;
- The 1 km square grid reference (this is crucial and will show the location name and the VC number);
- The age and/or sex of the bird;
- The breeding activity code, where relevant (see the BTO Atlas codes)
- The number of birds seen (please do not enter pairs as one record please enter the number of males then on the next line, the number of females);
- In the comments column please enter any other aspects of the observation that are pertinent.

All of these details are stored. As the records are handled electronically, it does not matter how frequently you record the observations. However, please enter each record on a separate row.

I look forward to receiving records from existing and new observers.

Observers need to be mindful of the Welsh and national (ie UK) lists of rarities.

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Weather Summary 2017

2017 was a particularly wet and variable year, with few periods of settled weather. The trend for warmer, wetter weather than the average continued. The year started dry and cold with some snow in the middle of January and this month was generally much drier than average. February started with a short cold spell but was mostly mild and dull with average rainfall. Storm Doris caused some structural damage and resulted in many fallen trees between 22/02 and 23/02. March was a wet month with notable rainfall on 1/03 and 23/03. High pressure developed from the south in April and this was mostly a dry and warm month with a short cold spell at the end of the month. May was a remarkably warm and dry month, with plenty of sunshine. This all bodde well for breeding birds. June, however, was changeable with rain and westerly winds. There was a short hot spell between 16/06 and 21/06 but this was atypical of the summer as a whole. July was warm with short spells of particularly heavy rainfall, notably 21.4mm was recorded at Hawarden on 21/07. Whilst August was drier, it was a dullish month with low pressure systems and fronts moving in from the west at regular intervals. The changeable weather continued into September with rain falling on most days. Westerly/south-westerly winds prevailed for much of October and it was a much drier month but rather dull. The first frosts of the late autumn occurred on 30/10. November was generally mild, wet and

dull. There were occasional frosts but no prolonged cold spells. December was the wettest month of the year. There were alternating mild and cold spells. Scattered wintry showers were recorded between 7/12 and 16/12 and significant snowfall came on 10/12. The year ended with the arrival of Storm Dylan.

Birding Highlights 2017

This paper briefly summarises the main birding highlights and events for 2017. The paper is based on all records received by the County Recorder and subsequently verified by the Welsh and British Birds Rarities Committee. There will be discrepancies between this report and those published in other sources because some records cannot be verified by description or are just not submitted in the first instance. Such records are not included in this report. However, genuine omissions also occasionally occur and for this we offer our apologies.

2017

As usual, the coast didn't fail to disappoint the birdwatcher at the beginning of the calendar year. In January there was a maximum of 23 Bewick's Swans at Shotwick Boating Lake on 8/01 along with a single Long-tailed Duck. A Glaucous Gull and an Iceland Gull were seen off Towyn on 14/01. Two drake Surf Scoters were seen offshore between Llanddulas and Colwyn Bay for several weeks from 16/01 to 13/02 along with two Velvet Scoters at approximately the same time. Two Great Northern Divers were reported off Llanddulas on 29/01. The first Firecrest of the year appeared at RSPB Conwy and Black Redstart were recorded at several coastal locations. Inland a Roughlegged Buzzard at Fenn's Moss was notable. The winter influx of Waxwings continued in 2017, with a maximum of 190 seen at Denbigh on 7/01. January was the peak month but some Waxwings stayed on into March. Five Snow Buntings were regularly seen between Gronant and Point of Ayr from mid-January into March. February got off to a good start with a Green-winged Teal at Connah's Quay NR on 6/02. At the same site the Twite flock peaked at 103 on 11/02. The only Grey Partridge record of the year came from the Wrexham area on 9/02. A Slavonian Grebe was seen off Llanddulas on 20/02. A maximum of 20 Brent Geese (pale-bellied hrota sub-species) were seen at Talacre on 14/02. Mediterranean Gulls were seen at several locations, including two inland at Gresford flash.

March was a fairly quiet month but large numbers of Common Scoters accumulated offshore and 20,000 were seen from Point of Avr on 12/03. There were several sightings of the usual **Great Grey** Shrike in Clocaenog Forest and of several late winter records of Water Pipit. Seven of these were in March at RSPB Conwy. An early Wheatear on 8/03 was notable. The main migration month was April but there was little out of the norm, other than a single Black Tern at Shotton on 22/04, followed by 5 at Connah's Quay NR on 30/04 and 11 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 5/05. The first Yellow Wagtails appeared on 18/04 but there were fewer records overall for this species compared to previous years. The only Spoonbill record for the year was at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 8/05 and at the same site a Garganey was seen on 11/05. A Wood Sandpiper flew into RSPB Conwy on 5/05 and the biggest surprise of the month was a **Caspian Gull** at the same RSPB reserve on 13/05. Fenn's Moss was the most reliable site for seeing Hobby and breeding was proved there later in the summer. A Blue-headed Wagtail was sighted at Talacre on 22/05. The highlight of June was the confirmation of Firecrest breeding in Clocaenog Forest. This was followed by the probable breeding of Osprey at Llyn Alwen, Mynydd Hiraeddog. Seabird movement at Point of Ayr on 8/06 included Manx Shearwater, Arctic and Great Skua. The Common Tern colony at Shotton had 407 nests which resulted in 399 young being ringed over the summer. Uncommon species in July included Garganey and Little Stint at RSPB Conwy and two records of Quail at Gronant and Fenn's Moss. Wader and seabird passage produced 6,000 Common Scoters off Towyn on 15/07 and 1,200 Curlew at Point of Ayr on 23/07. Whilst it was nice to see so many Curlews, none of these birds appeared to breed in the recording area - a sad state of affairs. A maximum of 600 Little Terns were counted at Gronant in July. This was after an excellent breeding season with 161 breeding pairs producing 202 fledglings. The only bird of note in August was a **Corncrake** flushed from Shotwick Rifle Range on 4/08. There were many good records of seabirds and seaduck in mid-September. This included two Leach's Petrels and a Great Skua off Colwyn Bay and a Sabine's Gull at Point of Ayr. A Grey Phalarope turned up at RSPB Conwy on 14-15/09. Great White Egrets are now turning up on a regular basis and six individuals were present on the Dee Estuary from 10-21/09. There was an exceptionally late Yellow Wagtail at Shotwick Fileds on 30/09. In October two Pomarine Skuas flew over RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 22/10 and unusually there was an inland sighting of Long-tailed Duck at Fagl Lane, where the bird remained until 5/11. The Black-tailed Godwit numbers on the Dee Estuary peaked at 4,000 in November. Nine Greenland White-fronted Geese turned up at Warren Farm, Talacre and stayed to the end of the year. A Great Grey Shrike was seen in the Llyn Brenig area at the end of the month. Gull watching proved rewarding in December. An Iceland Gull was at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 16/12 and it was likely that the same bird was then seen at Connah's Quay NR the following day. At Llanddulas an adult Glaucous Gull, which appeared on 23/12, obligingly stayed around well into 2018 and was seen by many, many birdwatchers. A Lesser Spotted Woodpecker was found at Marford Quarry, near Wrexham on 19/12 and allowed several local birdwatchers to view what is now an increasingly uncommon species. Despite the major UK Hawfinch influx in 2017, few birds were sighted in NE Wales but 2 were seen at Gwynfryn on 27/12 - a nice end to the year.


We have abbreviated the names of months to just three letters (eg Jan, Feb, etc).

We have included maps to show the distribution of the records received for most species where we considered that maps would assist the summarising of those records. If you are aware of areas of the country where those species are present, but there are no symbols to show their presence, please send in records to the Recorder. Please also use the maps to spur you into action if you know that a species breeds near you but is not shown. This will add to what is shown in 'The Breeding Birds of North Wales'

The maps, below, show the sources of records used in this report. First, there is the map of all the BBS sites. Second, there is the map showing all the GBW sites and last a map showing the locations of all sites from where complete lists in 1km squares were recorded in BirdTrack.

We have continued to include a table which is an attempt to summarise the information available and to use the basic data to provide further information about how easy it is likely to be to see any particular species in this region of Wales, but especially in the 1 km squares in which the species has been observed. To explain each of the headings:

Status. This is a statement about each species based mainly on the results of the Atlas project that led to 'The Breeding Birds of North Wales'. Generally these are:



Resident Summer visitor Winter visitor Passage migrant Visitor Vagrant Escape

Occurrence. We do not have good population estimates for the majority of species in North-East Wales. Some bird reports have used words such as 'abundant' without any criteria for determining the use of the words. Here, we are using a formula to calculate a figure that is then used to determine the word to describe how abundant a species is. The formula is: (Average max count)/3 * (Average no of records). These average figures are taken from a database of these figures that have been published in recent bird reports.

The words chosen to describe the species are taken from the table, above.

Number of 1 km squares. This is the number of 1 km squares in which a species was recorded during the year. The numbers of 1 km squares in each county are taken from the Gazetteer which is available from the CBRG website: Denbs = 1965. Flints = 589, total = 2554.

Maximum count. This is the same figure that I has been shown in the last few reports and is the maximum count for each species in each county I during the year. Records come from several sources that do not, necessarily, conform to the requirements of our database. So, there may be

records e.g. from WeBS sectors that span more than one 1km square, so may be higher than the maximum count shown in the table.


Av max count prev 10 yrs. This is the average of the maximum counts for the previous 10 years.

Recorded in BBS squares. When a species has been recorded during a BBS survey this is the number of squares in which the species it was recorded out of the number in the county. There were 30 BBS squares in Denbs in 2013 and 15 in Flints.

Number of records. As in previous reports, this shows the number of accepted records received for each county during the year.

% of records from GBW. Rather than mentioning this in the text for some, obvious, garden species, this is included for all species that occurred in the GardenBirdWatch lists.

% of BirdTrack lists. This is a figure calculated using all the complete lists that have been submitted on BirdTrack during the year and provided by the BTO within the download of records for County Recorders. A species is more likely to be encountered if the percentage shown is higher than for another species. For some species this figure is much higher for relatively scarce species in Denbs because of the numbers of lists submitted for RSPB Conwy.



Density. This is an attempt to show how likely it

is that a species will be encountered somewhere in North-East Wales. The figure is from a formula: (Max count) * (No of locations where recorded) /(Total no of squares in that county). The numbers of 1km squares in each county are: 1976 in Denbs and 589 in Flints.

Max breeding evidence. This is the Atlas code of the evidence of breeding of the highest level found during the year. Sometimes this was given by an observer within BirdTrack. Sometimes, this was derived, e.g. from the ringing of nestlings (= NY). Please add breeding codes whenever possible.

At the end of this section Anne Brenchley has written about the first and last dates for migrants. Please continue to send records of the first dates you see migrant species and keep records so that you know when you last saw them, when they have migrated away. This information shows up very well in the BirdTrack graphs created from complete lists of bird records. We are very keen to know these last dates as well as when they arrive.

The systematic list is presented in two sections, firstly the Category A and C species then those that are in Category E.

Category	Explanation
A	Species recorded in an apparently natural state at least once since 1 January 1950.
C1	Naturalized introduced species – species that have occurred only as a result of introduction.
C2	Naturalized introduced species – species with established populations resulting from introduction by Man, but which also occur in an apparently natural state.
C3	Naturalized re-established species – species with populations successfully re-established by Man in areas of former occurrence.
C4	Naturalized feral species – domesticated species with populations established in the wild.
E	Species recorded as introductions, human-assisted transportees or escapees from captivity, and whose breeding populations (if any) are thought not to be self-sustaining.

However, in Flints, while most records in recent years have again been of the pale-bellied race, there are occasional records of the dark-bellied *bernicla* race, the majority of which winter in the S and E of the UK and continental Europe. This year all records which specified race were of the pale-bellied sub-species.

Denbs. The only record was 1 at RSPB Conwy on 27/10 (JFJ).

Menai Strait and Y Foryd in Gwynedd. Records

Flints. On the Dee Estuary 15 were recorded at Talacre on 11/02 and numbers had increased to 20 by 14/02 (GR); after this numbers declined, a single being seen at various locations until 12/04 (TMT, PeHa) . The first of the autumn were 6 at Talacre gas terminal on 3/10 (RLE), 1-2 were at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on various dates until 3/11 (PSH). There were 13 recorded during WeBS counts on 19/11 (GR) were the last of the year and the largest count of the autumn.

A ubiquitous species, certainly our commonest ⁴ goose, found on estuaries and most lakes, ponds and other water bodies and recorded from both ³ counties in all months of the year. Post-breeding concentrations can occur in autumn/early winter on a number of sites including the Dee Estuary,

Gresford Flash, RSPB Conwy and Llyn Brenig, many birds remaining to winter.

Denbs. This species was recorded from 53 inland squares and 6 coastal ones, 54% of records being from RSPB Conwy. Numbers appear to have recovered somewhat from the lows of the last two years. this year's maximum count for the county of 400 at RSPB Conwy on 25/06 (SCh) being almost twice that of 2016. During Jan – Mar the largest counts were at Lleweni Hall, Bodfari where there were 42 on 27/02 and 32 on 6/03 (JPH) and RSPB Conwy with 55 on 12/03 and 57 on 9/04 (JHq). Other notable counts during the early months of the year were 33 at Kinmel Bay on 4/02 (JPH), 65 at Cae Llwyd Reservoir, Penycae on 14/04 (SD) and at Acrefair with 58 on 21/04 (NHu) and 60 on 4/05 (JLR). Breeding was observed at Sydallt, Llys Aled Isaf, Hiraethog, Gresford Flash, Lleweni Hall and RSPB Conwy, rather fewer locations than last year. Interestingly, the first reported hatchlings were all reported from Sydallt, Llyn Aled Isaf and Gresford Flash on the same day, 17/05. From early Jun flocks of non-breeders and some early family parties began to form and as usual RSPB Conwy hosted the largest concentrations with 319 on 11/06 (JHg), the annual maximum of 400 on 25/06 (SCh) and there were 255 on the Conwy Estuary on 14/07 (WRM). Recorded numbers were low during Aug to Oct until the regular post-moulting flocks began to gather at Gresford Flash during early Nov, when 300 on 3/11 was the winter maximum, after which numbers tailed off as the month progressed. The Dec maxima were 45 at Lleweni Hall on 18/12 (JPH), 21 on 23/12 at Gresford (SD), and 52 at RSPB Conwv on 26/12 (JPH).

Flints. In general, last year's recovery in numbers was maintained, though the peak count for the year of 2,347 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 31/10 (DWn) was somewhat lower than last year and still below the long-term average. Records were predominantly from the Dee and Clwyd estuaries, though there were also sightings from eighteen inland squares. On the Dee Estuary the usual midestuary reserves were the most favoured locations, with large numbers regularly recorded from RSPB Oakenholt Marsh especially during the later months of the year, though Connah's Quay NR and RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and Shotwick Fields appear to have attracted smaller numbers than in recent years. White Sands remains the most favoured roosting/ loafing area and Llawndy Farm at Point of Ayr attracted significant numbers on several dates throughout the year. During Jan numbers on the estuary were generally low, the largest counts being 250 at Connah's Quay NR on 3/01 (MD) and 290 at Talacre on 26/01 (DCR). During Feb things improved somewhat with 600 on White Sands on 12/02 (DaK) and the same number at Connah's Quay NR on 18/02 (DCR), after which numbers declined and remained low on the estuary into the spring/early summer breeding season. The usual flocks of non-breeders and early family groups began to form from mid-May, when 131 were recorded on RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 14/05 (CW), 250 at Connah's Quay NR on 29/05 (JHo) and 400 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 27/06 (PSH). The first 1,000+ count of the year was 1,500 on White Sands on 13/08 (DaK), numbers increasing steadily thereafter, especially at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh where 2,000 were recorded on 22/09 (PSH) and an annual maximum of 2,347 recorded on 31/10 (DWn). Numbers remained high throughout the remainder of the year with several counts of 1,000-2,000 from RSPB Oakenholt Marsh, and significant numbers also recorded at White Sands, Flint saltmarsh and Talacre/ Llawndy. On the Clwyd Estuary numbers were more modest than the Dee. though significantly higher than in 2016. The early year maximum was 280+ at Rhuddlan on 3/02 (DCR) and the post-breeding congregations during Aug/Sep included 507 at Rhuddlan on 13/08 (JHB) and the estuary's maximum of the year of 515 on the middle estuary on 12/09 (JPH). Numbers declined from the end of Sep with 326 on 28/09 (JPH), being the estuary's last 100+ count of the year. The only breeding records were from Connah's Quay NR and Rhyl Brickworks pond.



Denbs. Singles were at RSPB Conwy on 26//03 and Sydallt on 27/03 (GNR, KS); then 1-2 were again at RSPB Conwy from 7-22/06 (JHg).



Flints. Small numbers were present in the RSPB Oakenholt Marsh RSPB / Connah's Quay NR area from 2/02, when 11 were at Oakenholt; up to 5 were regularly recorded in this area until mid-Mar (GEM, PSH), after which 2 remained throughout the summer until at least Oct. There was an influx of small numbers towards the end of Oct, with 17 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 31/10 (DWn). These remained throughout the rest of the year, with a maximum count of 19 on 24/11 (DWn); during this period they remained largely faithful to the Oakenholt / Connah's Quay area and occasional birds showed up in other parts of the estuary.



This species comprises a resident feral breeding population that is relatively widespread on suitable inland water bodies This population supplemented by numbers of passage, and overwintering birds during the winter months. Recorded in both counties in all months of the year: the majority of records during the spring and



summer months are of small numbers on inland sites, probably indicating resident territorial breeding pairs, though records of actual breeding are relatively uncommon. These resident birds concentrate into post-breeding moulting flocks on a number of sites notably the Dee Estuary and Gresford Flash. When the River Dee is in flood, the Trevalyn Meadows, Ridleywood and Worthenbury areas of the lower valley attract significant numbers on an almost annual basis.

Denbs. As usual RSPB Conwy, the most regularly recorded location, provided most records, though this year its share was somewhat reduced at 43%. Numbers were relatively low, the annual maximum for the site being 29 on 6/07 (JHg). Lleweni Hall, Bodfari again held the largest numbers in the county. Early in the year numbers increased during early Feb with 93 on 2/02, an early year maximum of 169 on 27/02, 117 on 13/03 and 59 on 3/04 (JPH), after which pairs dispersed to breeding territories. Breeding behaviour was reported from several locations, the first pair on territory being noted on 6/04 and the first goslings on 7/05. Goslings were seen at Nant-y-ffridd, Afonwen, Llyn Aled, Lleweni Hall, and Llyn Brenig. The post-breeding flocks at Llyn Brenig were somewhat larger than in 2016, with120 including juveniles on 22/07 (SD). Gresford Flash, Wrexham attracted the county's largest congregations of the year, with numbers beginning to climb in late Oct, with 150 on 22/10 (KS) and an annual maximum of 650 on 3/11 (HL). Numbers remained relatively high throughout the remainder of Nov, with 320 on 21/11(BF). Lleweni Hall also recorded good numbers during Dec with 426 on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. The Clwyd Estuary was again the most regularly used location for this species, with almost 50% of all records. During Jan and Feb numbers in the middle estuary were significantly higher than in 2016, with an early year maximum of 348 on 29/01 (JPH). As usual, relatively small numbers were on the estuary during the summer, but post-breeding congregations began to gather in late Jul, with 133 on the middle estuary on 20/07, increasing to 480 on 13/08. There were several counts of close to 200 throughout late Aug, Sep and Oct, culminating in an autumn peak count of 500 on 29/10 (JPH, WRM). By contrast numbers on the Dee Estuary were relatively modest for much of the year. While small numbers were widely distributed at locations throughout the estuary, there were very few records approaching 100. RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands recorded the majority of significant counts with Shotwick Fields attracting modest numbers during the spring and early summer, after which the Border Pool had several significant counts, with a maximum of 90 on 23/07 (CW) and other counts of up to 63 during late summer and early winter. However, the areas around Point of Ayr appeared to attract the largest numbers of the autumn and early winter, with 150 in Ffynnongroyw Bay on 10/09 (GR) and 477 at Talacre dunes on 19/11 (JPH).

Significant counts from inland sites during the early part of the year included 31 at Hendre on 8/02 (MGW); 70 at Penbedw on 26/02 (GEM) and 31 at Fagl Lane GP on 25/03 (SD). While there were birds present in suitable inland breeding habitat throughout the spring and summer, pairs with young were only recorded from three regular locations at Fagl Lane GP on 30/04, Padeswood on 2/05 and Penbedw on 12/07. The only record of significant numbers at an inland location during the winter months was 85 at Fagl Lane GP on 30/10 (GNR).



Denbs. There were only two records during the vear, 1 at Lleweni Hall. Bodfari on 13/03 (JPH) and 12 flew over at Brynhyfryd in Clocaenog Forest on 26/10 (JOH).

Flints. The overwhelming majority of records 7 were from the Dee Estuary, where the recent trend of substantially increased numbers 6 continued, though peak counts were significantly lower than in 2016. On the Dee the majority of Jan records were from RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands. where modest flocks were feeding during the early part of the month, numbers increasing to a maximum of 1,500 here on 15/01 (CW). As the year progressed most records were from middle 3 estuary locations where numbers continued to increase with 2.000-3.000 recorded at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh or Connah's Quay NR and



roosting on White Sands from early Mar to mid-Apr, with an annual maximum of 3,500 recorded on White Sands on 23/03 (PSH). Numbers declined from mid-Apr, the last of the spring being 2 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 5/05 (CW). The first returning birds of the autumn were 70 on White Sands on 10/09 (PSH). Modest numbers were feeding at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands during much of Sep and early Oct, counts increasing to 300 on 6/10 and 1,000 on 9/10 (pCW). These may have been short staying passage birds as there were no further records of significant numbers until 2/11, when 2,000 were recorded from both RSPB Oakenholt Marsh and White Sands (PSH, AGr). After this there were regular records of 2,000+ from various locations in the middle estuary during Nov and early Dec, with notable counts of 2,500 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 6/11 (CW), 2,850 at White Sands on 29/11 (PDS) and an annual maximum count of 3,000, again at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 7/12 (pCW). Numbers appear to have declined somewhat towards the turn of the year. The only records from locations away from the Dee were from the Clwyd Estuary, where 4 were recorded on 29/01 (JPH) and 1 on dates from 7/10 to 10/10 (WRM).





Denbs. As usual the majority (69.5%) of records were from RSPB Conwy, where this species was recorded throughout the year. The largest numbers recorded during the early months of the year were at Sutton Green in the lower Dee floodplain where 22-35 were recorded on various dates from 11/02 to 20/03, after which numbers declined to 11 on 6/05 (NHu). Another location with significant numbers was offshore at Towyn, where a small herd of 20-27 was recorded from 11/02 to 21/03 (JPH). At RSPB Conwy up to 18 were recorded in the southern section of the reserve from 15/01 to 19/05 (JHg). Birds bred on the reserve at Conwy and the first cygnets were observed on 19/05 (GEM) and 5 were counted on 30/05. A pair with two cygnets was also recorded at Pensarn on 25/06 (WRM). After the breeding season numbers settled down and at RSPB Conwy up to 18 were counted on various dates during the later months of the year. The largest inland count of the early autumn was 16 at Hanmer on 15/07 (SD).

Flints. As usual most records were from coastal locations in or around the Dee and Clwyd Estuaries. As in previous years the largest concentrations on the Dee Estuary were on Shotwick Fields and later in the year on White Sands. The year started with substantial numbers in the upper estuary particularly at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands, where there were 139 on 1/01 (AGr), 50 at Deeside Industrial Park on 2/01 (DSw) and 79 at Shotwick on 12/02 (BaB). Otherwise small numbers were widely distributed around the estuary throughout the early months of the year. The first record of breeding was from Connah's Quay NR, where cygnets were seen on 20/05 (PSH). Later in the year White Sands attracted the largest concentrations with counts of 50-60 during Nov and RSPB Oakenholt Marsh had up to 38 in mid-Dec (PeHa). However, these were exceptional and very few counts of 10+ were reported during the second half of the year. On the Clwyd Estuary numbers were similar to 2016. There were counts of up to 36 during the first half of the year, the maximum being recorded at Rhuddlan on 1/05 (DCR). After mid-Jun numbers declined; the majority of records were in single figures and the late year maximum of 11 was in the middle estuary on 28/12 (RLE). Breeding was recorded from the middle estuary, with cygnets seen on 13/05 (AHJ) and from Rhyl Brickworks pond where the first cygnets were on 20/05 (HC) and on 15/06, when there were 7 including juveniles (JPH).



Flints. Numbers had only recovered a little from the low point of 2016, the maximum count remaining less than 50% of the 10-year average. A small flock was present at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and adjacent compartments from the start of the year until mid-Mar. Counts were usually from 3-14, with a maximum of 23 at Shotwick Boating Lake on 8/01 (IMS). The only other locations from which this species was recorded were Connah's Quay NR and White Sands, the latter providing the last record of the year with 9 on 12/03 (DaK).

Denbs. Singles were at Kinmel Bay on 29/01 (JNW) and another (or possibly the same) nearby at Towyn, on dates between 9/03 and 21/03 (SM, JPH). Later in the year one was at RSPB Conwy on 7/10 (JHg) and 2 at Lleweni Hall on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and adjacent locations attracted significant numbers during Jan, with 47 on 1/01 (Agr, pCW) providing the maximum count of the year. This flock remained in the area for most of the month, though numbers varied markedly, with 36 on 8/01 (IMS) being the last double figure count at Shotwick Fields. During Feb and Mar records were mostly from middle estuary locations; Connah's Quay NR and White Sands were favoured. The latter provided the only double figure counts during these months, with 28 on 12/02 and 12 on 12/03 (DaK, WeBS). The last Dee record of the spring was one at Connah's Quay NR on 23/03 (PSH). The first of the autumn were on 8/10, when 4 were at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh (PeHa) and 3 on White Sands (DaK). Numbers remained modest until mid-Nov when the first double figure records of the autumn were on 19/11, with 18 on White Sands (DaK) and 28 on the Border Pool at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands (Agr). Modest numbers remained on the estuary for the remainder of the year favouring RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and RSPB Oakenholt Marsh. Away from the Dee singles were recorded on the middle and upper Clwyd Estuary, on various dates from 1/01 to 13/04 (JPH, AHJ, WRM). In the autumn one was again on the middle estuary on 10/10 and 3 on 17/10 (WRM) and 2 were near Rhuddlan on 3/12 (JPH). The only record from an inland location was 2 at Hendre on 2/03 (GEM).



This coastal duck is found on most estuaries and was recorded from both counties during all months of the year. The Dee Estuary is a site of international importance for this species.



Denbs. Only ten reports were from inland and

these constituted only 9% of all records. RSPB Conwy provided 85% of the total number of sightings. Numbers were significantly lower than during 2016, with only two counts on the same day of 100+. The maximum count of 157 was 34% down on that of 2015. During Jan and Feb, virtually all records were from coastal locations, predominantly RSPB Conwy, its adjoining estuary and Kinmel Bay. Numbers were relatively modest, with most counts less than 20 and a maximum of 55 at RSPB Conwy and the adjacent estuary on 11/02 (WRM). During Mar numbers began to increase and continued to an early peak on 4/04, when 157 were counted at Conwy (TMH), which was also the annual maximum. These congregations remained into early Jun when the breeding season got underway. The first family party of adults with small ducklings was seen at RSPB Conwy on 27/06. By 10/07 a scan of the E bank of the estuary revealed five families with attendant crèches of young (WRM). After the breeding season the majority of records were of small numbers in single figures, the only counts of 10+ being between 30/11 and 4/12, when 12-14 were at RSPB Conwy. The general annual trend

in numbers is reflected in the table of WeBS counts at RSPB Conwy (see below). The only inland location where significant numbers were recorded was Lleweni Hall, Bodfari where there were notable counts of 33 on 27/02, 29 on 6/03 and later in the year 39 on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. Only four locations were inland and from these there were only six records, again emphasising the maritime habitat favoured by this species. The most important locations were the Dee and Clwyd Estuaries. In contrast to Denbs, counts were considerably up on last year's disappointing numbers, with a maximum count of 2,315, almost double that of 2016. During Jan to Mar the largest numbers were in the Point of Avr / Talacre area, where there were several counts of 120-169, though the maximum count for the period was 200 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 18/02 (PSH). In Apr and May there were 100+ counts from Point of Ayr, Ffynnongroyw and RSPB Oakenholt Marsh. From mid-May the last location increased in importance, with several counts of 1,000+ during Jun with a mid-year maximum of 1,200 on 8/06 (PSH). There was only one record of breeding on the Dee, iuveniles being recorded at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 4/06 (PSH). As can be seen from the table of WeBS counts below, the largest concentrations of the year were after breeding in Sep and Oct. This year the areas that attracted the largest numbers were Point of Ayr and Ffynnongroyw Bay where on 10/09 the WeBS count recorded 400 at Ffynnongroyw and 800 at Point of Ayr (GR). A month later on 8/10 the count was even higher, with 600 at Ffynonngroyw and 2,315 at Point of Ayr (JLg); the latter was the maximum count of the year and almost twice that of last year. A thousand at Oakenholt on 26/10 (DWn) was the last record of this magnitude, although there were several counts of 100-300 during Nov and Dec.

On the Clwyd Estuary numbers were rather more modest, though there were counts of 100+ from both the upper and middle estuary in several months of the year particularly during Feb-Mar. At this time 170 were near Rhuddlan on 9/04 (JHB) and during the May to Jul breeding season, when crèches of juveniles added to the flocks in the mid-estuary S of Rhyl, a maximum count of 126 was recorded on 15/06 (AHJ). From the end of Jul numbers declined, though there were several counts of 80-100 during late Nov and Dec (WRM, JPH).



native China, appears well established and spreading steadily from a few localities in the W of the report area, where there are quiet stretches of river or secluded ponds close to deciduous woodland, which provides suitable tree-hole nesting sites.

Denbs. The steady increase in both number of records and the distribution of this species has continued. As usual the majority of sightings were from the middle Dee Valley, primarily between Llangollen and Chirk, but also several from locations in the lower valley. Within this area most records were of small groups of up to 7 or family parties of females with ducklings. A female with 9 ducklings was at Holt dykes on 14/05, a family group near Trevor on 17/05, another female with 8 was at Froncysyllte on 23/05 and a female with 3 presumably larger juveniles at Sutton Green on 24/07 (DaHu, SuLo, NHu). The population in the middle Clwyd valley continues to prosper with regular sightings at Lleweni Hall, Bodfari, where there were records of significant numbers in almost all months of the year except during the breeding season between May and Jul. Notable records at Lleweni Hall included several counts of 10+ including 21 on 4/09, a maximum for the year of 31 on 11/12 and 24 on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. The only record was a group of 5 at St Asaph on 19/04 (ShG).



Denbs. Recorded from coastal and inland locations throughout the county. Almost 80% of all records were from RSPB Conwy, where this species was recorded in all months of the year.



However, numbers were generally modest, the majority of records being 1-3. No counts reached double figures, 8 on 12/12 (JHg) being the maximum for the year at this location. Away from Conwy the largest counts were recorded in the E of the county, though numbers appear to have been lower than last year. Gresford Flash was the only location which recorded counts into double figures, good numbers being present throughout Jan, with a maximum of 45 on 13/01 (HL) and smaller numbers present during Feb and Mar. The last of the spring was 1 seen on 6/03 (SzB). The first record of the winter was 2 on 16/09 while small numbers remained to the close of the year, 29 on 14/12 was a higher count than most (HL).

Flints. Most, i.e. 90%, of records were from locations around the Dee and Clwyd estuaries. There were only ten records from inland locations. On the Dee Estuary the majority of records were from the usual upper estuary locations at Connah's Quay NR, Shotton Paper Mill and RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands. There was a marginal increase in numbers from last year. During the early months of the year modest numbers were recorded from all the above sites. While the majority of sightings were in single figures. Connah's Quay NR had several instances when 10-20 were present. The maximum for the period was 24 on 15/01 (PSH). The last spring record of significant numbers was 9 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 9/04 (CW) and presumably the same 9 nearby at Shotton Paper Mill the following day (IMS). There were very few records after this during the summer months to the end of Aug. The only sightings during this period were odd singles (and on one occasion 2) seen on a few occasions at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and 5 at Broken Bank. Shotwick on 31/07 (KS). There were no sightings at all during Aug. The first birds of autumn were 4 at Connah's Quay NR on 6/09 (PSH), with increasing numbers present on this reserve from then onwards. As usual the pools at Shotton Paper Mill attracted the largest numbers during the autumn and winter periods. The first WeBS count of substantial numbers was 48 on 9/10 (IMS). Good numbers were present for the remainder of the year (see table above); the maximum count of 99 on 19/11was almost double that recorded in 2016. Away from the Dee, 1-5 were recorded on the Clwyd Estuary from 22/01 to 3/04, 12 on 19/02 being exceptional (WRM, AHJ, RLE). Notable records from inland sites included 11 at Hendre on 8/02 and 14 on 19/02 (MGW, GEM), and 8 at Ddol Reservoir, Ysceifiog on 1/12 (SD).



This species occurs in modest numbers intermittently throughout the year, appearing to favour freshwater or brackish ponds and lakes, with relatively few records from intertidal areas.



Denbs. As usual the principal location was RSPB Conwy, which provided 98% of all records and where the species was recorded in small numbers in all months of the year. There were other coastal sightings from Towyn and Pensarn, each of which had single records and inland records from Afonwen and Holt. At RSPB Conwy the late winter/early spring peak in numbers was in mid-Mar when 33 on 14/03 and 31 on 19/03 (JHg) were the largest counts of this period. Numbers tailed off as the spring breeding season arrived and from mid-Apr to Sep there were very few double figure records. The only record of breeding was a female with seven half-grown ducklings on 14/07 (WRM). Numbers increased from the beginning of Oct and 37 on 1/10 (JPH) was the first record of significant numbers in the latter half of the year. From Oct onwards numbers were significantly up on last year, with counts regularly in the range 10-20 during Nov and Dec with notable records of 40 on 15/12 (RLE), 43 on 3/12 and again on 30/12 (JPH), all at RSPB Conwy. The only other location with more than a single record was Afonwen, where 2-8 were recorded on several dates between 8/10 and 27/12 (MGW, SD).

Flints. The locations with most regular records for this species were Shotton Paper Mill pools, which appeared to attract the majority of the Deeside population, and to a lesser extent RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands and Connah's Quay NR; though the last two sites do not attract the numbers recorded at Shotton Paper Mill. Together these three sites account for 74% of all records in the county. During the early months of the year, up to the start of the breeding season, Shotton Paper Mill pools recorded the largest numbers with an annual maximum of 61 on 16/01 (IMS) and several other records of significant numbers (see table of WeBS counts above). Reasonable numbers were also recorded at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on a few occasions, with notable counts of 21 on 21/01 (MREP), 10 on the Border Pool on 12/03 (TG) and 10 on 9/04 (CW). Connah's Quay NR regularly had small numbers, mostly from 1-4 throughout this period. From early Apr numbers reduced as breeders left and during May and early Jun most records were of 1 or 2. The only record of breeding was at Shotton Paper Mill, where ducklings were present among a total of 33 on 12/06 (IMS). There was an even larger count of 55 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands two days later on the 14/06. There were only two records during Jul,;singles seen at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 2/07 and Connah's Quay NR on 4/07 (CW, PeHa), but there were no sightings during Aug. Small numbers were recorded from all these


locations for the remainder of the year, but Shotton Paper Mill continued to attract comparatively substantial numbers with a maximum of 39 on 19/11 (IMS). Away from the Dee, 1-2 were recorded on the Clwyd Estuary on several occasions during Mar to May. The only inland records were from Llyn Helyg, with 8 on 16/01 and 2 on 13/02 (AB), Rhyl Brickworks Pond where 1 (and on two occasions 2) was seen on various dates in Jan and Mar (AHJ, JPH, RLE) and Ddol Reservoir, Ysceifiog with 4 on 12/02 (MD) and 8 on 1/12 (SD).

grazing on coastal fields or inland on flooded farmland. Numbers decline in the spring as birds migrate to breeding grounds in northern Europe.

Denbs. As usual RSPB Conwy provided the vast majority of records, with 91% of recorded sightings. The trend of reducing numbers noted over the last few years has continued. The maximum count of 370, while almost twice that of 2016, was only 64% of the long-term average and again there were only a handful of counts of over 100. The vast majority of records were from coastal locations, and in addition to RSPB Conwy there were relatively small numbers of sightings from coastal locations around the Kinmel Bay area. As last year the largest numbers during the early months of the year were recorded at the latter location, where on 4/02, there were 370, another 125 in another area of the bay and 126 nearby at Horton's Nose (JPH, AHJ), At RSPB Conwy numbers remained modest throughout the early months, with only two records of 100+ (see WeBS data in the table below). The last of the winter/early spring period were 21 on 28/03 (JPH). The only records during the summer months were several records of a single at Conwy from 27/05 to 2/06 (JHg, MiB, RLE). The first returning birds of autumn were 4 on 27/08 and 10 on 30/08, but the first significant numbers did not arrive until late Sep, when there were 65 on 27/09 and 106 on 2/10 (WRM, JHg). There were three counts of 151-155 during early/mid-Nov, after which all subsequent records were less than 100. Inland locations produced far fewer records than usual, small numbers (<10) being seen at several locations. Lleweni Hall, Bodfari had 15 on 4/12 and 33 on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. As usual the vast majority of records were from coastal locations on the Dee and Clwyd estuaries. The year began with good numbers throughout the Dee Estuary, several counts of 600+ being recorded from RSPB Oakenholt Marsh, Connah's Quay NR and White Sands, the last having 700 on 15/01 (JLg). Counts remained high into Mar and on 12/03 801 were recorded at Llawndy, Point of Ayr (RCR) and 720 on White Sands (AGr), but as the month progressed numbers declined. There were 330 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 19/03 (PSH), the last substantial count, though smaller numbers hung on into Apr, and 25 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 9/04 (CW) was the last double

figure count of the spring. From late May to late Sep the only records were sightings of 1-4, mostly from Connah's Quay NR, after which the first returning migrants started to arrive. The first count of significant numbers was 125 at Connah's Quay NR on 30/09 (PSH). From Oct on, counts at Connah's Quay NR increased steadily, peaking during Nov, when 2,500 were recorded on 8/11, 4,000 on 19 and 23/11 and 5,500 at Flint on 27/11(PeHa, DWn). The last was the year's maximum. Numbers were more modest throughout the estuary during Dec, most counts being 100-700 and 2,000 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 13/12 (PeHa) was the only record of 1.000+ for the remainder of the year. The Clwyd Estuary also had significantly higher numbers than last year with several counts of 230-450 recorded during Jan to mid-Mar. The maximum for the early months was 643 S of Rhyl on 18/02 (JPH). This was over twice the 2016 maximum. As migration got under way in mid-Mar, the last significant count of spring was 54 on 25/03 (AHJ). The only summer records were 1 or 2 seen on dates during Apr and 1 on 27/05 (RLE, AHJ, WRM). The first bird of autumn was 1 on 31/08 (WRM), followed by 17 on 22/09 (AHJ). There were several counts of 100-600 from late Oct to the end of the year, the maximum for that period being 745 on 5/12 (JPH). There were even fewer records from inland locations than usual, the only sightings reported being 1-5 noted at Fagl Lane GP, Hope on various dates in Oct (NHu, GNR) and 27 at Llvn Helvg on 20/11 (AB).



Denbs. RSPB Conwy provided 46% of all records and the species was recorded there in all months of the year. The peak counts for the site are all detailed in the WeBS data table below. Of the coastal

locations, Towyn recorded significant numbers both early and late in the year, with an early year peak of 60 on 23/01, 50 including juveniles on 4/07 and an autumn/winter maximum of 50 on 24/11 (SM). Inland, Stryt Las, Rhosllanerchrugog had the largest count during Jan with 65 on 8/01(SD); Acton Park had modest numbers throughout the year, which peaked in Sep with 64 on 10/09 (GPr). Erddig Pool also attracted good numbers throughout the second half of the year, with counts of 60+ during Aug to Nov (NHu, HCw). The largest count of the year was 300 at Hafoty in the lower Conwy Valley on 28/08 (HC), though these could have been released birds. Breeding was recorded at several locations and the first ducklings were reported on 10/04 at Erddig Pool (HCw).

Flints. On the Dee numbers were generally modest, with very few records of 50+ throughout much of the year and most records were of less than 30. The majority of the larger counts are detailed in the table of WeBS counts above. During Jan the outstanding counts were 50 at Deeside Industrial Park on 2/01 (JAt) and at Gronant where there were counts of 30-56 from 15 to 18/01, reasonable numbers being maintained at the latter location until mid-Mar (GR, WRM). The outstanding count of the early months and indeed the year was on 12/03, when 840 were recorded during WeBS counts on the NW section of White Sands (AGr), but there were no other records approaching anywhere near these numbers. It was not until 23/05 that the first ducklings of the year were recorded at Connah's Quay NR (PSH), over a month later than other inland locations and the more enclosed Clwyd Estuary. There were also records of juveniles from Point of Ayr Fields, Greenfield Valley, Shotton Paper Mill and Prestatvn in late May and Jun. Numbers began to increase on the middle estuary reserves from mid-May, with 280 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 16/05 (GEM) and 200 at Connah's Quay NR on 26/05 (PSH). There were several counts of 100-400 on these reserves during Jun and Jul. As the year progressed numbers declined and there were none of the large autumn counts usually encountered. White Sands and RSPB Oakenholt Marsh produced counts of 75-100 from during Sep and early Oct (see WeBS table above), but the only 100+ records of the later months were at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh in Dec with160 on 6/12 and 100 on 13/12 (PeHa). On the Clwyd Estuary numbers were broadly similar to 2016, though the peak count of 137 at Rhuddlan on 13/08 (JHB) was a 65% increase on the 2016 equivalent. Other notable counts included an early season peak of 62 on 8/01, 57 at Rhyl on 15/06, 65 on 23/09 and 54 on 5/12 (JPH). The fluctuations in numbers throughout the year can be seen on the table of WeBS counts above. Rhyl Brickworks pool had modest numbers throughout the year. The peak count there was significantly down on last year, with 65 on 29/12 (JPH). Other inland locations with notable counts included Hendre with a peak of 39 on 14/11 (GEM); Faql Lane GP with 53 on 2/01 (NHu) and 60 on 18/11 (SD); and Ddol reservoir, Ysceifiog with 40 on 1/12 (SD). Breeding was recorded at several other locations.


The Dee Estuary had significant numbers from early in the year. The Jan WeBS counts on 15/01 recorded 320 at Point of Ayr (GR), 400 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh (PeHa) and 700 on White Sands (JLg). Numbers peaked during Feb and Mar. when 2.000 were recorded at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 2/02 and 3/03 (PSH), though these numbers were exceptional 200-500 was a more characteristic level, particularly after the end of Mar, when numbers declined rapidly, the last record of spring was 27 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 30/04 (PSH). The first early returners of the autumn were 2 at Connah's Quay NR on 13/08 (PeHa). There were several records of up to 5 in succeeding weeks, but it was not until early Oct when 800 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 11/10 (PSH) marked the first significant influx of the autumn. However, these did not stay and apart from two records of 235 at Point of Ayr mudflats on 19/11 and 250 on 3/12 (GR), counts were more usually in the range 1-34 during the autumn/winter period. The only record away from the Dee was of 2 on the middle Clwyd Estuary on 3/12 (MaO).

The Dee Estuary is a site of international *importance for this species. It was widely distributed at both coastal and inland locations *sthroughout both counties and was encountered in wetland habitats of any size with suitable cover. Recorded in each month in both counties.



Denbs. This species was recorded from eighteen inland and thirteen coastal locations, of which RSPB Conwy provided 83% of the records. At RSPB Conwy numbers were somewhat higher than last year, with an early year peak of 100 on 5/01 (NHB). While this was significantly up on 2016's early year maximum, it perhaps gave an indication of the year to come that this was also the annual peak count, the sole three figure record of the year, and only 46% of last year's annual maximum for this site. As can be seen from the table of WeBS counts below, numbers remained modest throughout the early months of the year, the majority of counts during Jan to Mar being less than 30. The only other notable records were 83 on 15/01 (JHg) and 58 on 7/02 (JPH). Lleweni Hall, Bodfari, was the only other location where significant numbers were recorded during the early months, with several counts of 18-33 during Jan to Mar and a peak count of 65 on 27/02 (JPH). As might be expected only small numbers were recorded from late Mar to late Jul, as the majority of birds left for breeding grounds, but the sole record of breeding within the county was a sighting of a female with six ducklings at Llyn Aled on 31/05 (GEM). The first double figure count of the late summer/autumn was 11 at Conwy on 24/07 (JPH) followed by 27 on 4/08 (JHg). During the autumn and winter months numbers remained modest, 93 at Conwy on 10/09 (JHg, WeBS) being the largest count of the second half of the year. There were also several counts of 50-80 during Sep to Dec. Lleweni Hall had significant numbers in Dec with 56 on 18/12 (JPH).

Flints. The overwhelming proportion of records was from locations around the Dee and Clwyd estuaries. On the Dee there were reasonable numbers throughout the upper estuary sites during Jan, as shown in the table of WeBS counts above. Numbers drifted lower during Feb and Mar. A count of 91 at Oakenholt on 9/04 (PeHa) was the last substantial count of the spring and 25 at Connah's Quay on 14/04 (GEM) was the final double figure record. There were only four May and Jun records of small numbers (1-3) at Gronant dunes, Shotwick Fields and Hendre. The first returning migrants of autumn began to arrive during mid-Aug, with 30 at Connah's Quay NR and 20 at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 18/08 (PSH), followed by a major influx on 21/08, with 500 at the same place (GR). Numbers

peaked during Sep and Oct, with 1,000 recorded at RSPB Oakenholt Marsh on 7/09, 10/09 and 8/10 (PeHa), declining somewhat into Nov and Dec. As well as RSPB Oakenholt Marsh, Connah's Quay NR and to a lesser extent Point of Ayr/Talacre and White Sands, continued to record counts of 100-600 during the remainder of the year. On the Clwyd Estuary, the middle estuary attracted most birds during the early months with a maximum of 129 on 8/01 (JPH); the last significant numbers of the first half of the year were 100 on 4/03 (WRM), small numbers remaining into Apr when the last spring sighting was 8 on 11/04 (JPH). There was an early returning single on 13/08 (WRM), but larger numbers were not until 10/09, when 40 were S of Rhyl (WRM), followed by 150 on 22/09 (AHJ), numbers increasing through Sep to Dec peaking with 386 on 5/12 (JPH).



Flints. Several sites around the Dee Estuary held sizeable flocks, some of which persisted through the summer. Breeding was confirmed at Connah's Quay NR in Jul. There was a notable concentration of nests at Lleweni Hall, Bodfari, with 42 around at least nine active nests on 12/06, rising to 64 on 10/07 and 166 on 4/09, when many fledged young were present (JPH). Breeding was confirmed at several locations. Post-breeding dispersal and autumn migration movements were noted from 24/07, with at least 60 near Llangollen (JLR), 36 at Llyn Brenig on 1/08 (JPH), at least 150 at Penycae on 9/08, with a Hobby hunting them (JAJ) and 42 at Moel Arthur on 8/09 (GEM). Although no roosts were recorded, there must have been a spectacular brief roost near RSPB Conwy, where 10,000 were seen over the large lagoon at dusk on 14/09 (JHg). Steady numbers continued to be seen on migration until the last week in Sep, with 50 at Chirk on 25/09 (DaHu) the last double figure count. The latest report was the only Oct record, with 7 near Moel Famau on 6/10 (AOH).

Flints. The first was a single returning to a breeding site at Bagillt on 28/03 (GRMP) – one day earlier than the first Denbs record. Thereafter returning migrants trickled in, with the first double figure counts of 10 at Rhyl Brickworks on 10/04. There was then notable passage past Gronant in early May: 40

Welsh Ornithological Society) but there are no such records in Clwyd Bird Reports.

Denbs. RSPB Conwy was again a regular site, accounting for 60% of all records, with one bird seen in much of Jan and from 9/03 to 11/03. There were often records of 2 in the late winter period, falling to 1 from 4/12 till the year end. All the other records related to a pair in Clocaenog Forest. Initially a bird was seen carrying a feather to build a nest on 23/04 (AnCu) and still building on 11/05 when one was carrying moss and feathers. During the BBS season counts of between 10 and 18 were not unusual and the highest BBS count was 29 at Craig Bron Bannog, Clocaenog Forest on 17/06 (HKd, MaO). However, the maximum count was 43 in a BirdTrack list for Pwllcrochan Wood, Colwyn Bay on 15/04 (HC), indicating a very high density of breeding birds. There were ten records of confirmed breeding. Up to the end of the year most records were of 1-2, but higher numbers were regularly recorded at Chirk Castle in the months of Oct, Nov and Dec, the highest being 18 on 19/10 (KGr).





Recorded in each month in both counties. There was a general increase in the number of records and a slight increase in distribution from 2016, but there was a marked decrease in the numbers of birds recorded this year. Very few records of breeding are reported each year and most of these are coastal. It would be good to receive breeding records from rural sites in the coming years. The majority of records were of 1-10. Numbers of this species can fluctuate markedly between years. The maxima were 5,000 in Denbs, a significant decrease from 2016, and 10,000 in Flints. The 10,000 roosting at Gronant in 2017 was the largest flock recorded in Flints since a figure of 15,000 was reported on passage over Rhuddlan in 2007.

Denbs. In the first winter period the largest count was from an inland site, when 2,000 were observed feeding in wet moorland at Rhydlydan near Pentrefoelas on 15/01 (JoG). The large roost observed at RSPB Conwy in 2016 failed to materialise in 2017 and appeared to have transferred to the Gronant site in Flints. Similarly, the Colwyn Bay pier roost did not exceed 250 during the year, when this number was counted on 16/11 (WRM). The pier will be demolished in 2018 so this roost site will disappear. As the breeding season approached, two flocks of 1,000+ were seen at Penycae on 4/03 (JAJ) and Bryn Ffynon, Llangwm on 13/03 (WO). The highest count on a BBS walk was 40 near Ruabon on 18/06 (CoRW) and the highest garden count was of 45 at Ysbyty Ifan, in week beginning 25/06 (SGb). The first confirmation of breeding was of recently fledged young seen at Towyn on 10/05

The largest counts were of 5,000, when a large flock, stretching hundreds of metres, was seen flying over the town of Caerwys at 09:20hrs on 21/11 (JoW). The large roost at Gronant, in a reedbed behind the Presthaven caravan site, reached peak numbers of 10,000 on 12/11 (WRM). At Towyn there were twenty-six counts of 100-200 between 5/01 and 18/03. The size of the flocks at Towyn decreased during the breeding season but a count of 80 was recorded on 30/06, possibly through the fledging of the first young of the year. Thereafter, counts in double figures became more regular again culminating in 19 records of 100-120 between 14/09 and the end of the year (all Towyn data from SM). Away from Towyn, the species' numbers followed a similar pattern during the year but most records were in single figures. The exceptions were all from RSPB Conwy where, in the first winter period, there was a maximum of 60 on 10/02 (WRM), followed by a count of 45 on 2/03 (WRM). Recorded on twenty-five BBS walks with the highest count being 58 at Cefn Mawr on 5/05 (DAW). There were twenty-two records of confirmed breeding in the vice-county as a whole. Confirmed breeding (FL, ON, FF, NY) was recorded and the first was of a nest with young at Towyn on 19/04; the first fledgling of the year was recorded at Towyn on 6/05, and the last confirmed breeding record was of a fledgling at Towyn on 5/08 (all SM). 

In the early spring there were 18 at Nant-y-Glyn on 15/03 (HC), which proved to be the year's maximum count. Out of ten records of confirmed breeding, two were of occupied nests and eight were of recently fledged young. It is possible that some of the latter records were duplicates but the pattern appears to hold for Flints also (see below). (IMS). There were twelve records of confirmed breeding. The first was of an adult carrying a faecal sac or food at Fagl Lane GP, Hope on 26/04 (GNR). The other eleven records were of recently fledged young, the last of which was from Rhydymwyn on 8/08 (GRMP). Post-breeding and up to the end of the year most of the records were of 1-2. The highest count during this period was 7 at Pantymwyn on 26/10 (GEM).

Flints. The first record was 3 at RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 18/04, with 6 there the following day (AGr). The first in 2016 was 20/04. There were five records in Apr, ten in May, three in Jun, three in Jul, four in Aug and one in Sep. All but one of the records were from the coast between Gronant dunes and Shotwick Fields/RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands, with evidence of breeding at just one site – Beeches Farm, Sandycroft on 29/04. The last of the year was of 2 at Shotwick Fields/RSPB Burton Mere Wetlands on 30/09 (CW). This was an exceptionally late date. The last date in 2016 was 20/08.





Most records were of singles. The maxima for 2017 show a clear reduction compared with the ³ average maxima for the previous ten years.



Denbs. There were thirty-seven records from

RSPB Conwy, with nine between 19/03 and 9/05 during the spring passage and twenty-eight between 24/07 and 2/10 during the autumn passage. All records from this site were of singles, apart from two records of 2 and one of 3 during the autumn passage (all JHg). The first date in 2016 was 28/03 and the last 29/09 both from RSPB Conwy. Elsewhere there was 1 at Pentrefelin, Conwy Valley on 20/03 (MiB), and 8 were at Borras, Wrexham on 26/4 (KS).



The first was of an apparently occupied nest at Llansilin on 16/05 (JO). The first fledgling of the year was noted at Eglwyseg on 31/05 (NiSu). The last confirmed breeding record of the year was of a fledgling at Lleweni Hall, Bodfari on 16/08 (JPH). A crevice in the Jubilee Tower on Moel Famau provided a nest site, which was revealed on 24/05 by an adult carrying food back for



size of the flocks, with the highest count being 100+ at Penycae on 28/03 (JAJ). At the start of the second winter period the coastal records dominated, with a maximum of 35 at Kinmel Bay on 19/11 (JPH). In Dec, some 65% of the month's records were from the coast, though the largest flock in that month was 10 at Holt on 22/12 (NF).

Flints. The first record of the year was 12 near Rhuddlan on 1/01 (SH). Most of the records in every month of the year were from coastal sites. The largest count in the first winter period was 26 near Rhuddlan on 27/02 (AHJ). Most of the records in Mar were also from the coast, where there was a maximum of 79 (probably on passage) at Rhyl promenade on 12/03 (JPH). Denbs. Most records were from inland, upland sites, although the first record of the year was 1 at Fenn's Moss on 6/04 (RbHa). The first date in 2016 was 15/04. This was followed by 1 at Pentrefelin in the Conwy Valley on 23/04 (MiB), 1 at Pendre on 25/04 (JoG) and 1 at Llandegla Forest on 30/04 (NoWi). 

counts in Flints returned to normal levels after a dip in 2016.

Denbs. Some 92% of records were in single figures, very similar to previous years. One hundred and twenty-one were counts of 10-30, with five counts higher than this. A flock of 30+ was seen feeding in a small turnip field at Clawddnewydd on 10/02 (GPI). The maximum was 112 at Nant-y-Glyn on 30/10 (HC). The largest BBS count was of 22 at Craig Bron Bannog, Clocaenog Forest on 17/06 (HKd, MaO), but considering that this is one of our most common and widespread species it was surprising that there was no evidence of confirmed breeding. The highest GBW count was 36 at Ysbyty Ifan in week beginning 17/09 (SGb). Only one sick bird was noted this year.

Maximum monthly counts in each county:

Flints. As in Denbs most of the counts were of 1-9 (92%), with sixty-four counts of 10-30 and eight above this. The maximum counts were 250 at White Sands, Dee Estuary on 18/11 (PSH, PDS), with 150 still present at the same site on 14/12 (PDS). At Plas Bellin between Northop and Connah's Quay, 150 were seen on 29/11 (DWn). The largest breeding survey count of 18 was along a stretch of river at St Asaph on a WBBS transect by ShG on 19/04. The highest GBW count was 33 at Rhydymwyn in week beginning 12/02 (DMH). Over the year 82 full-grown birds were ringed at Shotton Steelworks (pBH), 60 at Bagillt (GRMP) and 12 at Sychdyn (IMS).

There was a similar number of records, but these were more widely distributed and recorded in higher numbers, to those of 2016. Sightings in the latter part of the year were much earlier than on average.

Denbs. The majority of records were in single figures, with ten records of 11-40. At Chirk Castle numbers at the beginning of the year fluctuated between 2 and 40 from 5/01 to 1/02. The maximum number of 40 was observed on 14/01 and 1/02 (JRn). The last, early winter records were all on 16/04 when 2 were at Garth, Trevor Hall (JuBa) and singles were seen at Penycae (RMg) and Bwychgwyn (MaT). Birds are not usually seen again until early winter but this year sightings began in autumn. suffering from Trichomonosis. In the wider countryside birds were seen in woodland and in ⁴ stubble fields, often accompanied by other species such as Siskin, Chaffinch, Goldfinch and ³ Yellowhammer.

Flints. All records were in single figures. The maximum of 5 came from Pantymwyn on 8/03 and 22/03 (GEM). The last of the 2016/17 winter was seen on 9/04 at Penycloddiau (EdW) and the first of the following winter was sighted on 30/10 at Gronant (HC). Two individuals were ringed: 1 in a garden at Sychdyn on 10/03 and another at a garden at Bagillt on 8/11 (GRMP).

With the exception of one record on 14/05 from the east side of the Conwy valley at Llanrwst (MCh), all records were from outside the breeding season. Two were seen near Rhuthun on 2/02 and 9/02 (KS) and two at Gwynfryn on 27/12 (SD).

Recorded in each month in both counties, with a significant increase in records from both counties. The geographic spread of records increased in Denbs. almost trebling in five years.

Denbs. A similar pattern to previous years, with the large majority of records in single figures. There were twelve records of between 10 and 28, ten of which came from RSPB Conwy, particularly at the end of the year when an amazing 28 were seen on 9/12 (JHg). A good garden record was of 6 seen at Bwlchgwyn in weeks beginning 1/01 and 8/01 (MaT).

Flints. Some 96% of reports were of 1-5 with thirty-three records of 6 or more at a number of locations. The maximum counts of 10 were recorded at Pantymwyn on 30/11 and 8/12 (GEM) and 12 at Llanfynydd on 19/01 (GNR). In total, 35 were ringed at Bagillt (GRMP), Sychdyn (IMS) and Shotton Steelworks (pBH).

Recorded in each month in both counties, with the number of records dropping slightly again this year. Very few flocks exceeding 20 were recorded. There were only two records of sick birds in the Towyn area this year.

Denbs. As in 2016, almost all records were of 9 or fewer – 97% of all reports - with just twenty-three counts of 10-41. The maximum of 41 came Towyn on 13/08 (JPH) and 30 at RSPB Conwy on 10/07 (JHg). During the year ringing sessions at Glan Conwy captured 135 full-grown birds, mainly during the winter months. In gardens, 15 were counted at Trevor Hall, Garth in week beginning 8/10 (JuBa).

Maximum monthly counts in each county:

Flints. Some 96% of records were of 9 or fewer, with twenty-seven counts of 10-51. There was only one flock over 30 and this maximum of 51 was seen on the mudflats at Point of Ayr on 23/03 (JPH). Breeding season numbers were low with the highest count of 4 recorded on a BBS transect at Cilcain on 29/04 (JaH). Ringing sessions at Bagillt captured only 50 full-grown birds on various dates throughout the year, only half the number from 2016.

There were fewer records and possibly fewer birds in both counties than in the previous three years.

Mar numbers varied, with flocks of up to 60 seen and a few birds remained into Apr when the last sighting of the winter was on 24/04, when 6 were recorded. A total of 24 was newly ringed and individually colour-ringed in Feb and Mar. This year only one bird from other ringing sites was recaptured, that being a Twite ringed at Machrihanish on the Mull of Kintyre in October 2014 and recaptured at Connah's Quay NR three

Recorded in each month in both counties. The increase in records continued this year from Flints. The majority of large flock counts came from coastal sites. Breeding was confirmed in both counties.

Denbs. Some 88% of reports were of 9 or fewer. There were ten counts exceeding 30. The largest counts were 80 at Kinmel Bay on 30/09 (WRM), 100 feeding on a weedy fallow, agricultural field near Rhuthun on 26/03 (GPI), 100+ on a weedy stubble field at Llanbedr Dyffryn Clwyd on 5/04 and the maximum of 162 at Towyn in a larger finch flock feeding on a field of recently harvested oilseed rape behind Kinmel Bay sewage plant on 13/08 (JPH). A count of 55 was recorded on a BBS walk at Gellifor on 24/06 (TP).

Maximum monthly counts in each county:

Flints. Here, 62% of counts were of 9 or fewer, showing that the increase in records in double figures has continued this year. There were one hundred and twelve counts of 10-50 and a further twenty-four of more than 50. Records exceeding 100 came from coastal sites. Flocks at Gronant/Talacre built up over the summer from 50 to 150 between 27/06 and 2/08 (HC). At Connah's Quay NR, the regular summer and autumn flock exceeded 100 on several dates with the largest flock of 280

recorded on 18/09 (RBe). The maximum count of 301 was recorded on 15/01 at Talacre Gas Terminal (AnRo).

In Flints the distribution of records meant that birds were not seen in the summer months of Jun, Jul and Aug. Breeding evidence was very limited this year, with only probable breeding in both counties.

Denbs. The highest numbers of records were reported this year since 2004 but numbers are still low compared to ten years ago. There were only six counts that reached double figures: these were 11 on 6/03, 16 on 20/09 and 22 on 3/02 all from Chirk Castle (JRn/KGr); 12 at RSPB Conwy on 1/11 (PEM); 50 at Tanyfron west of Wrexham on 29/01 (SD) and 60 in a mixed flock with about 50 Goldfinch




Recorded in each month of the year. In Denbs, the geographic spread increased again.

Denbs. There were forty-six counts in double figures with small flocks of 10+ seen at a wide range of sites throughout the winter months. Some of these records came from gardens in Llandegla, Talygarth and Trefriw. The five highest counts were of 42 at Bod Hyfryd on 8/01, 50 at Llangollen 17/10 (GPI) and the maximum of 50+ seen at Pwllglas on 11/01, Llandyrnog on 18/01 (GPI) and Marford Quarry on 2/02 (TrB). Ringing at Glan Conwy recorded 91 captures of full-grown birds in the first four months of the year (MiB). The only record of confirmed breeding came from Llyn Brenig, when JPH observed recently fledged young on 1/08.

Flints. The majority of records came from the eastern half of the county, with fewer garden records than in 2016. Only eight records were in double figures mostly between 10 and 20. However, the maximum number recorded was 200 when on a morning walk AB saw a very large flock congregating in coniferous forest north of Bwlchgwyn. The sounds of these birds twittering was almost deafening. IMS caught and ringed 44 full-grown birds in a garden at Sychdyn in the early months of the year





Denbs. There was only one record in double figures, when 12 were seen at Holt on 18/07 (NF). In Penycae, there were regular visits of 1-3 to two gardens on dates between weeks beginning 8/01 and 6/08 (RMg/JoR). Records of confirmed breeding came from Pensarn, Erddig, Wrexham and RSPB Conwy.










This table shows the recorded first and last dates for most of the species regarded as migrants in north-east Wales.

The mild warm spring seemed to have two effects, winter visitors left a little later than usual and many migrants, warblers in particular, arrived early. Both Redwings and Fieldfares stayed into April with 20/04 being the last date on which a Fieldfare was recorded. Sedge Warblers, Garden Warblers,

Lesser Whitethroats and Wheatears arrived on the earliest date since records were kept in 2004. The first Garden Warbler arrived five days earlier


than in any year in the previous fourteen years. Hobby also arrived much earlier than on average with the first sighting on 3/04. However, the arrival dates for many other migrants were fairly average this year and by April most migrants had put in an appearance.

After the breeding season, some terns were late leaving and a Common Tern was seen on 3/10 and an Arctic Tern on 27/10. A Nightjar flushed at Fenn's Moss on 3/09 and a Yellow Wagtail sighted at Shotwick Fields on 30/09 were notable. The Swifts left in mid-August and many hirundines stayed into September and October, which is quite usual. However, there was a late straggler House Martin at Rhyl Brickworks on 14/11.

September brought the first records of winter thrushes, with fourteen Fieldfare and six Redwing seen at Bagillt on 27/09.

Breeding passerines at RSPB Conwy nature reserve

Introduction

RSPB Cymru's nature reserve at Conwy is a 50

hectare (125 acre) wetland site located between the A55 trunk road and the Conwy estuary. More than 95% of the surface area of the nature reserve is within vice county 50 (Denbighshire), with a small piece of land adjacent to the A55 lying in vice county 49 (Caernarfonshire). The habitats have been created in the 24 years since the RSPB took on the lease from the Crown Estate in 1994. It is a major visitor attraction, with more than 80,000 visits annually, providing many people – especially families and schoolchildren – with their first opportunity to discover nature.

Hughes and Money (2016) provided an overview of the first 20 years of the nature reserve, including the results of the first two surveys of breeding passerines. A third survey was undertaken in spring/summer 2017, and the results are presented below, along with some discussion on the changes recorded.

Method

The survey is an adapted version of the British Trust for Ornithology's Common Birds Census (Marchant 1983), involving four visits, one in each survey period: 1 to 15 April; 16 April to 7 May; 8 May to 28 May; 29 May to 14 June. Surveys were undertaken early in the morning (completion prior to 9am), in conditions of little or no wind. Surveys have been undertaken every five years: in 2007,

2012 and in 2017. The survey involves walking to within 50 metres of all parts of the site, and recording the activity of all passerines on a large scale map.

Maps were analysed at the end of the final survey period, and an assessment made of the number of pairs/territorial males of each species that occurred. For resident species that are present throughout the year, the four maps provide a good means of identifying individual territories consistently through the season. For summer migrants, greater caution has been used in interpreting the results during April to mid-May, when individuals singing on passage will be among the birds that attempt to breed on the site.

Results

The table shows the population estimates for passerines recorded during the three surveys. 24



Discussion

The species fall into four categories, based on the trends in breeding pairs.

to provide some context of the overall population.

Birds with a sustained increase in numbers: Wren, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Song Thrush, Blue Tit. With the exception of the last two species, all are increasing at a national level (Breeding Bird Survey in Wales), so the increase in numbers at Conwy is not too surprising. Garden Warblers are not abundant in North Wales, so it is gratifying to see the number of territories increase in 2017, probably to its highest ever level. The three warblers and Wren will all have benefited from the increase in mature scrub on the reserve, which provides both nesting habitat and a source of




Birds with a stable population since 2012: Dunnock, Robin, Blackcap, Lesser Whitethroat, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Great Tit, House Sparrow, Goldfinch, Greenfinch. All these species saw a substantial increase in numbers between 2007 and 2012, as the early successional habitats of the first decade of the reserve gave way to more mature trees and scrub, and older stands of Phragmites in the reedbed. Their numbers now appear to have stabilised, and some species may have reached carrying capacity for the site in its current state. The national trend for these species during the period varies greatly, between -61% for Greenfinch and +81% for Blackcap. Nationally, Greenfinch survival has fallen sharply since 2005, owing to Trichomonosis, a condition that affects the upper digestive tract. Some Greenfinches were seen at Conwy in 2009-10 with the disease, but their numbers appear

to have recovered quickly.

Birds showing a declining trend: Blackbird, ⁴ Whitethroat, Chaffinch, Reed Bunting. All four species are stable or increasing nationally (no ³ Wales BBS trend is available for Reed Bunting, but its UK population increased by 12% during 2004-14), so it's harder to explain why numbers



have declined at Conwy. Blackbird is, we suspect, a blip, but the decreases in the other species at the site are borne out by *ad hoc* observations by regular watchers.

Sporadic or colonising breeders: Woodpigeon, Carrion Crow, Bullfinch and Long-tailed Tit. These species have been recorded holding territory in just one of the three survey years. Ad hoc observations during the intervening years suggest they breed in some years but not others (as does Magpie, which didn't nest in any of the survey years). Woodpigeon and Carrion Crow require fairly mature trees in which to build their nests, and most trees on the reserve are only just reaching the size that they could host such nesting. Bullfinch and Long-tailed Tit are thought to have bred annually since 2013, and on a few occasions before 2012.

Implications for habitat management

None of these birds are a conservation priority for the management of the nature reserve, but we do want to maintain a variety of species that will be of interest to visitors, particularly those that are not

abundant elsewhere in North Wales (e.g. Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler) and those whose visibility or acoustic presence provides interest to new birdwatchers (e.g. Bullfinch, Reed and Sedge Warbler). This interest will be balanced with habitat management for priority species, including breeding waterbirds and moths of the grassland and scrub.

The area dominated by scrub (principally Bramble) has increased during the last 10 years, at the expense of open grassland. This has doubtless benefited many of the species surveyed here, but during the next decade, we anticipate that the structure of this scrub may become less suitable for some of these birds, as it becomes more 'leggy'. Selective removal and cutting back of scrub, on rotation, should maintain a patchwork of dense scrub and grass/herb sward of various height, managed through grazing by the reserve's Carneddau mountain ponies.

Stands of reeds (*Phragmites*) are a feature of the shallow edges of the lagoons, which were planted during the mid 1990s, and which provide nesting and feeding habitats for Reed and Sedge Warblers, and Reed Buntings in particular. The silty substrate and the constraints on control of water levels makes it difficult to manage the reeds using large-scale mechanical measures that would be seen at other major wetlands. Small-scale cutting and removal of reeds, and the removal of successional plants such as Willow, will be deployed to maintain the open nature of the reedbed and to encourage new growth.

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A Birder's Guide to Point of Ayr

Introduction

The RSPB Dee Estuary reserve is the fourth largest amongst the 200 it owns or manages in the UK. It covers just over 6,000ha, and encompasses over half of the entire estuary. At the western tip of the reserve, extending into the mouth of the estuary is Point of Ayr - a rich mosaic of tidal mudflat, shingle ridge, sand dune, and saltmarsh, bordered by migrant-loving scrub known as the Warren. Most of the Point is owned by ENI, the gas terminal company, and the RSPB manage the area east of the lighthouse in partnership with them. Natural Resources Wales are the other main landowner, along with Flintshire County Council. Virtually the entire Point has public access, and although the Talacre area is also a busy holiday resort during the summer months, it is still surprisingly easy to slip the crowds and enjoy some peace and quiet. Indeed, the area is shockingly under-watched, and has huge potential for finding your own rarities.

Waders and Wildfowl

The best place to view the waders and wildfowl that the estuary is justifiably famous for - the Dee is

the seventh most important estuary in the UK for wintering shorebirds and wildfowl - is at the RSPB hide. This can be accessed from the sea wall, and is a ½ mile walk east from Station Road. For

completely covered, and consequently is an important area for roosting waders. With Over 6,000 Oystercatcher, 3,000 Dunlin, 2,000 Knot and 2,000 each of Curlew and Bar-tailed Godwit recorded roosting during peak winter periods. The area is also important for wintering Pintail, Wigeon, Teal and Shelduck, with rafts of thousands of birds on the best winter tides. Peregrine regularly hunt the roosting waders, adding further to the spectacle, with Merlin regularly recorded here hunting the lark and finch flocks (which also regularly hold Twite).

Terns

Late summer sees the build-up of post-breeding terns, prior to their migration. High-tide roosts of over 1,500 Sandwich Tern are regularly recorded on the beach, or from the hide, with smaller numbers of Common Tern present too. Little Tern, from the nearby Gronant colony can also be present in good numbers.

Representing the only Little Tern colony in Wales, the conservation importance of this colony can't

be overstated. In 2016 and 2017 Little Tern successfully bred at the RSPB Point of Ayr reserve on the shingle ridge, for the first time in many years. An anti-predator fence is erected each year to help increase the terns' chances, with a few pairs of both breeding Ringed Plover and Oystercatcher regularly successful inside the safety of the fence too.

Warren Farm

Although just outside Point of Ayr boundary, this site is easily viewable from Station Road on route to Point of Ayr. Park in the car park on the right, just after the railway bridge, and then walk back to the bridge to view the wet fields to the west. The water levels here are managed for wintering birds, and are part of the mitigation for the offshore gas production.

The winter of 2017-18 saw a group of 9 Greenland White-fronted Geese overwinter here, with an accompanying spectacle of several hundred Black-tailed Godwit, along with thousands of other waders and wildfowl.

Another wetland area of pools and scrapes that is also managed under the same mitigation can also be viewed on the west side of the sea wall when walking to the RSPB hide. The small woodland here has a small colony of Little Egret and can be very good for wintering Chiffchaff.

Scrub and fixed dune

As mentioned in the introduction, the abundant scrub and fixed dune can be a superb area to search for migrant passerines, and the list of past finds is impressive. The 5 Red-rumped Swallow that roosted overnight on the 26th October 1987, is one of my personal rarity highlights from here, along with the splendid June Tawny Pipit in 2003.

The area is also very good for wintering Short-eared Owl, along with occasional Black Redstart and wintering Snow Bunting in the dunes.

Seawatching

For those prepared to be sand blasted along with their precious optics, the high dunes can be an excellent area to sea watch from during autumn westerly or north-westerly gales. Leach's Petrel is the Holy Grail, with all four skua species also possible along with Sabine's Gull. Sea watching from the hide is also possible, but there is trade-off between better weather protection and the loss of height and perspective.

Gronant Little Tern season summary, 2017.

This was the thirteenth season that Denbighshire Countryside Service have managed the Little Tern protection scheme at Gronant and the fourth year of involvement in the EU LIFE+ Nature Recovery Project. Having had reservations beforehand, primarily with concerns over tidal predictions at crucial moments in the season, the 2017 breeding period proved indeed to be a challenging one. However, the birds showed remarkable resilience and with the hard work by warden staff and volunteers the colony had a successful season with a productivity of 1.25 fledglings per pair. Of the many highlights of the year, breeding pairs were at record numbers and the 5-year average for fledglings per pair is now back at a sustainable figure. Details of the key numbers from the season are shown below.

A lot of effort was put into re-sighting colour-ringed terns this year and provided us with interesting results. The monitoring work highlighted mid-season colony swaps by adults, such as Isle of Man to Gronant, and fledglings moved from Kilcoole, Ireland to the Dee Estuary – a north-easterly direction!

Important changes too, detailed in this report, were made to our visitor management arrangements to help broaden our people demographic to the hut. The telescopes and binoculars proved popular with 300 visitors recorded using this equipment provided on site over the two and a half months.

Next year is the last of the EU LIFE+ Nature Little Tern Recovery project funding. There is still a lot of work to do if we are to make full use of this fantastic opportunity but we have already made great strides. Future plans include a proposal to find out about spatial distribution of our migrating little terns on passage. Current opinion points to use geolocators on a sample of birds to vastly improve our knowledge, presently based on a handful of recoveries and sightings outside Northern Europe.

Ringing Report

During 2012-2015 the ringing totals of NE Wales increased substantially by approximately 6,000 birds. This increase continued slightly in 2016, but in 2017 the totals dropped by 242 birds, the first decline since 2011. Over the past one and a half decades, the pulli totals have averaged around 3,300 birds and between 2001 and 2008 there were more pulli ringed than full grown birds but this seems to be a thing of the past. The dramatic increase in full grown birds ringed in the past three years is likely due to increased ringing effort.

After two poor breeding seasons, 2017 nationally proved to be better for most species but there were exceptions to this overall trend. In NE Wales, warbler totals were generally lower than the previous year apart from Reed Warbler, which mirrored the national productivity results very well. Some of the biggest declines in the number of birds ringed were seen in Willow Warbler (-158) and Chiffchaff (-39). The finches were another group where the totals were down, particularly Chaffinch (-91), Greenfinch (-84) and Bullfinch (-29). This may be due to the persistence of Trichomonosis. However, there are signs from other parts of the country of small increases in numbers.

On a more positive note, a better catch of Dunlin (+217) and Sanderling (+82) helped to increase the totals and subsequent recaptures/controls by SCAN Ringing Group. More Barn Owls were also ringed, but this could be due to an increased effort by ringers in providing more suitable breeding locations, namely nest boxes. Another factor in the increase in a number of species like Blue Tits (+419) ringed is likely to be an increase in mist netting effort. Blue Tits are one of the most commonly caught species at feeding stations, reflected in the ringing totals.

Total numbers of birds ringed per year in the last ten years:

Very few Stock Dove were ringed in the area (6), even with the good number of Barn Owl boxes being monitored. Stock Dove are listed as Amber on the 'Birds of Conservation Concern', compared with Barn Owl which are now listed as Green. It is perhaps an opportunity for ringers who are monitoring Barn Owl boxes to contribute some valuable data to this species.

We are lucky enough to have Little Tern breeding in NE Wales. However colonies seem to find it hard

to breed successfully without human assistance, so the Merseyside Ringing Group must have been thrilled when a report came through of a bird they had ringed as a chick which was later caught by a ringer on the Isle of Man.

During 2017, there were five birds found in NE Wales wearing foreign rings and five found in foreign locations, which were ringed in NE Wales. Half of these 10 were waders with the remaining five birds either gulls or passerines. A Goldfinch originally ringed in France was caught by Alan Robinson at Llywynmawr in April. The 140th Redwing from the BTO ringing scheme to be found in Portugal was ringed near Bwlchyddar, Powys in November 2016 and was found in Alijo in December 2017. Finally a very surprised Stuart Thomas caught the 10th British or Irish record of a Blackcap with a Czech Republic ring on.

I am grateful to the ringers in the area who have given up their time to study and catch these birds (in

Ringers are reliant on members of the public reporting ringed birds that they find. Rings can also be read on live birds by members of the public, helping to 'fill in the gap' of the birds life history. To report a ringed bird, go to www.ring.ac, and you will be sent the details of the bird, including where and when the bird was ringed.






